# Minutes

#### Meeting opened at 9:01

#### Chairperson's Report – Donna E.

- Moment of silence for those effected by the fires followed by the Serenity Prayer.
- Past Delegates present were Kay D., Panel 40; Jayme C., Panel 52 and Willie W., Panel 37.
- Donna went over the Assembly Guidelines and reminded everyone that all saved seats will be released at 9:15.

#### Approval of May 19, 2018 Assembly Minutes

- Jim B., Secretary asked for any corrections of the May Assembly Minutes.
- Vicki, D72 Correction to the wording in the second and third questions on page three. The word *recertified* should be replaced with *resubmitted*.

Motion to accept the May 19, 2018 Minutes as amended were approved.

**Treasurer's Report** – See Financial Report in the November *Bulletin* 

• Group Contributions – Tarisa thanked those groups which contributed and reminded everyone to include their WSO identification number with their contribution. Only six groups failed to list their WSO numbers this last quarter.

- Financials Tarisa reported that the Area is down 43% overall as compared to last year even though we brought in more money than last year. This is due to additional money spent on hotel and travel, 3 new Coordinator positions, and an increase in Public Outreach services. Convention and group contributions were down as well as.
- Contribution to WSO Last year the Area had a surplus of over \$20,000 which was sent to WSO. Tarisa will not make a recommendation to contribute to WSO at this time.
- 7<sup>th</sup> Tradition at Assembly Tarisa reviewed the cost of holding the Area's Assembly – almost \$7,000. The Seventh Tradition contribution at the May Assembly was only \$700. We are supposed to be selfsupporting. It is clear that we are short 90% of reaching that goal. A GR is entitled to get reimbursed for their 7<sup>th</sup> Tradition contribution by their group. Tarisa suggested that GRs discuss with their groups what their group could contribute to the  $7^{th}$ Tradition prior to the Assembly. If a receipt is needed to submit to your group, see Tarisa and she will provide you with one. Your DR or Area Treasurer can sign off on the receipt. Other Areas charge a registration fee to attend their Assembly to help offset the cost.
- 2019 Proposed Budget The proposed 2019 budget is around \$75,000. GRs should submit expense vouchers for attending the Assembly. Your Group or District pays for the first 100 miles of the GR's round trip and the Area pays for the mileage over the first 100 miles at \$.40 per mile. If you travel more than 200 miles round trip, the Area reimburses the first \$100 of a onenight stay, and your meeting or District will cover the remainder. We need to have an accurate accounting of these costs. If you do not ask your group for reimbursement, your group is not fulfilling its obligation to its GR. A future GR may have difficulty being reimbursed by your group if the precedent has not been set by prior GRs.

#### **Questions and Comments for Financials:**

Q. Jayme, Past Delegate – Asked for clarification as to our ample reserve and what the money in our CDs are for? Is that for

AMIAS Background checks?

- A. Tarisa –Currently there is \$35,000 in our ample reserve and \$20,000 in our checking account. We will use the money from our checking account to pay for the background checks which will cost less than as originally estimated around \$25,000.
- Q. Jayme, Past Delegate Why not take the money saved from the background check and donate to WSO?
- A. Tarisa Even though we will not spend as much on the background checks, our projected expenses for 2018 are \$3,000 more than the proposed budget. We do not currently have a surplus.
- Q. Tracey, D9 Why is there such a dramatic change in the Chase checking account 6263?
- A. Tarisa I do not know why.
- Q. Shari, D45 Group Contributions are down 6%. Are contributions down or are there fewer members in Al-Anon contributing to their group's 7<sup>th</sup> Tradition?
- A. Mary, GRC We know the number of active meetings but have no way of knowing how many members attend as a whole.
- Q. Micheila, D27 What is the difference between the cost of Live Scan and Trak 1?
- A. Unsure at this time.
- Q. Mimi How much were our expenses for the International Convention?
- A. We sent our Delegate and 2 Committee members who attended as their Area's service commitment.
- Q. Mimi Our expenses should not be as much as last year, for the International Convention only occurs every 5 years.
- A. Tarisa Has broken down the cost of the Assemblies (\$12,000), Board Meetings (\$10,000), Committee Meetings (\$8,000), Institutions Conferences (\$3,000 each), Public Outreach (\$5,000), SOS (\$3,000), Training (\$5,000) and Administration expenses (\$12,000) as to how much is spent each year. We have more people and more conferences occurring. We are busy.
- Q. Tammy, D17 The IRS allows \$.53 per mile. Why are we only allowing \$.40 per mile?
- A. Tarisa That is what was voted upon by our members and a non-profit is allowed to set a lesser amount than other organizations.

- Q. Vicki, D72 Hotel reimbursement is \$100 per room and it says that members are encouraged to share a room. Do we get reimbursed for only one in a room?
- A. You get 100 per person and your group is responsible for the remainder. If there are two in a room, you each get \$100 for a total of \$200. That should cover the cost of the room.
- Q. Ilene, D21 –The Assembly cost is around \$7,400. What is that?
- A. Tarisa Included in your handout, is the complete breakdown on the Assembly costs. The Assembly cost was \$6,799. There are 4 items that were unusual expenses. The Area had invited Sue P., a staff member from WSO to attend. Therefore, we were responsible for her airfare, lodging and all other expenses associated with her visit.
- Q. Libby, D75 At her meeting, a lot of members come without a wallet. Perhaps the Area could encourage everyone to bring some cash.
- Q. Keith, D21 How many group Treasurers are unaware they are supposed to contribute to the various services arms and some groups carry a much higher balance than is needed? DRs should be reminding the GRs in their district to make sure their Treasurers have this information.
- A. Tarisa The District Treasurer should be informed as well.

#### Vote to accept the Financials:

- Roll Call of all GRs in attendance was updated by the GRC. Total of 182 voting GRs.
- Micheila, D27, made a motion to accept the financials as presented. Tracey, D9, seconded the Motion.

Motion to accept the Financials as presented was approved. 93% in favor, 3% against and 4% abstained.

#### Questions and Comments on Proposed 2019 Budget:

Q. Jayme, Past Delegate – In the proposed Budget, there is a line item for the Long Timers Event. This Event is held every three years and will not be held in 2019. We need to extract the \$1,000 from the proposed budget.

- A. Tarisa Thank you. You are correct.
- Q. Loraine, D69 Is there a line item for the Assemblies?
- A. Tarisa Yes it is in the budget, but broken down by Mileage, Hotel, etc. rather than by event.
- Q. Joyce, D69 We need to amend the budget if we remove the \$1,000 for the Long Timers Event.
- A. Tarisa This means we receive \$1,000 less but would also spend less for there are expenses for this Event. Possibility of moving the \$1,000 income budgeted for the Event to increasing the 7<sup>th</sup> Tradition. The budget would remain the same. The 7<sup>th</sup> Tradition would now be \$3,000 instead of \$2,000.
- A. Eva This is just a proposed budget and all figures are estimates.
- A. Tarisa There was no expense for 2018 for the Long Timers Event, therefore the proposed income from the Event was zero.
- Q. Tracey, D12 There is a high balance in our checking account, why are we paying bank fees?
- A. Tarisa We do not pay bank fees for our accounts. There is a \$50 per month fee for a check scanning device that we use.
- Q. Micheila, D27 The International Convention is every 5 years. Do we budget this out over a five-year period?
- A. Tarisa Some items we do, but not the International Convention.
- Q. Chip, D69 You list a depreciation expense. Who does that get paid to?
- A. Eva This is a depreciation value and not an expense.
- A. Tracey, D12 It is a depreciated value and is taken out over the course of time.
- Q. Allen, D27 There is an App for check scanning and it is free. A check scanner is as obsolete as a fax machine.
- A. Tarisa We process around 200 checks per month and a free App would not be practical.
- Q. Nancy, D12 Budget for International Convention is not budgeted over time. Why not?
- A. Tarisa We are forming a Finance Committee and we will add that for the Committee to look into.

#### Vote to accept amended Budget:

• Chris C., D40, made the motion to accept the amended budget and Tiffani, D17, seconded the Motion.

Motion to accept the amended 2019 Budget was approved. 94% in favor, 2% against and 4% abstained.

#### Alternate Delegate Report - Eva B.

• The *Forum* can and the Ask-It-Basket (AIB) are on the far side of the stage. #### • Sharing of Service (SOS)

- Eva Announced that pre-registration opens today for the SOS Workshop to be held on January 19, 2019. Cash and checks are accepted. There is a table in the lobby to register today.
- Jayme, Past Delegate, will be hosting the first workshop of the day to present a 12 Steps in 20 Minutes exercise. She was part of this exercise at the International Convention and found it quite rewarding. This will be an interactive exercise that can be shared among members around their tables.

# **Delegate Report** – Marcia M. See Delegate Report handout and in the November *Bulletin*.

• Marcia thanked everyone for allowing her to attend the International Convention. As a thank you she will be raffling off one copy of *Intimacy in Alcoholic Relationships*, 2 copies of the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary edition of *One Day at a Time in Al-Anon* and two CD sets of the opening and spiritual speakers from the Convention. The raffle will take place after lunch today.

#### • Use of outdated Al-Anon Literature:

*Marcia* reviewed some correspondence with Sue P. at WSO, regarding the use of outdated literature. Please use the most current literature available, as it reflects today's culture. This includes the current *Al -Anon/Alateen Service Manual 2018-2021*, which contains various updates that reflect current policy or practice. Use only

9

Conference Approved Literature (CAL) and do not hand-typed copies of CAL literature. This is a copyright violation and a typing mistake can get circulated with negative consequences.

• July 2018 Chairperson of the Board (COB) Letter:

Marcia detailed the highlights from the COB letter:

- 2018 International broke attendance records; 4,044 attended
- Next International Convention in 2023 is in Albuquerque, NM
- Board of Trustees approved to provide professional interpretation for Spanish and French speaking Delegates
- The Board of Trustees directed the WSO to send a statement to all groups on the importance of creating safety guidelines.
- The Board of Trustees directed the WSO to establish a fair and balanced *Do Not Refer Policy*. This will allow the WSO to support the Area's *Do Not Refer Policy*, and if the Area's Policy is accepted by WSO, a meeting that has been designated as *Do Not Refer* in the Area, will receive that same designation in the WSO database as well.
- October 2018 Chairperson of the Board (COB) Letter:
  - Marcia detailed the highlight ts from the COB letter:
  - Just for Tonight bookmark is ready for print. If you have AFG Connects and or In the Loop, you can see when they will be available. You can subscribe to In the Loop email at al-anon.org/emailme.
  - There are WSO At-Large Committee Members positions available. You can live anywhere to hold one of these positions. Deadline to file is 1/1/2019.
- Marcia advised that the WSO financial information is available on the WSO website. The electronic version of the 2018 World Service Conference Summary is now available on the WSO website and the 2019 World Service Conference will be held in Virginia Beach. The theme is Action is Attraction There is No Growth in the Comfort Zone.

• Marcia advised that the Area has two email communication links that your questions and/ or concerns can be sent. For Alateen/AMIAS related questions it is alateenamiasconcerns@scws-al-anon.org and for member questions group and it is groupandmemberconcerns@scws-al-anon.org.

#### Old Business –

- District 64 Task Force Tabled until Donna has a chance to consult with all members of the Task Force.
- Review of Evaluation Form -

Donna, Chair – One of the main requests on the Evaluation Form from the last Assembly was that all recommendations for votes take place in the morning. These issues and all supporting documentation will be posted on the Area's website at least 30 days prior to the Assembly. After the recommendation has been presented in the morning at the Assembly, there will be a Question and Answer period, per the Knowledge-Based Decision-Making (KBDM) during which GRs may ask questions and/or voice concerns. After lunch, there will be a short time allotted for further questions and answers. At that time a vote will be taken to see if the GRs are ready to vote. This will be more than a simple 50%+1 majority vote: it will be a 2/3 majority vote. This represents a substantial unanimity rather than just a simple majority. If the vote is ves, the Assembly will proceed to the vote. If it is no, then it will be tabled until the next Assembly. All presentations, questions and answers, and comments from the Assembly will be added to the original presentation on the website.

- Addendum to the May Assembly, 2018 Motion which lowered the age at which Alateens age out of Alateen from 20 to 18: See Recommendation and KBDM process on handout and on the website.
  - Donna, Chair At the May Assembly, there was a recommendation and vote to change the upper age of Alateens from 20 (they age-out on their 21<sup>st</sup> birthday) to 18 (they age-out on their 19<sup>th</sup> birthday). This will begin on January 1, 2019. Today's presentation will not address this Motion. We are proposing an addendum to that Motion so current members in Alateen

who are 17 years or older will age out on their 21<sup>st</sup> birthday or January 1, 2021, whichever comes first.

- Bear, AASC Presented background information as to why the Area Alateen Task Force recommended the original Motion and the vote that was taken at the May Assembly.
- Kat, AAMC Currently there are older Alateens who are Committee or Convention Chairs who would not be able fulfill their commitments. We are proposing that the effective date for current Alateens be changed to January 1, 2021.
- Bear, AASC Over the next three years, Alateens will gradually age-out until January 1, 2021 and then everyone will age -out on their 19<sup>th</sup> birthday. The KBDM process on this Policy was presented and discussed.
  - Option 1: Policy as voted on by GRs at the May Assembly would stand and all Alateens 19 years of age and older would age out of Alateen as of January 1, 2019.
  - **Option 2:** Approve addendum so that gradual aging-out of older Alateens can take place until January 1, 2021.

#### **Questions and Answers:**

- Q. Mia It was stated that there were problems with older members, I have not seen that in Alateen and Alateens should not be treated a children.
- Q. I do not know what you expect of Alateens. They grew up with addiction in their families and are more likely to take the wrong path. Older Alateens can give the younger ones guidance and support.
- Q. Brenda Our experience has been that without older Alateens in our group, there is chaos. Younger members seem to follow and respect the older Alateens. I understand that it is too late to change this Policy.
- Q. Mia Based on of the 5<sup>th</sup> KBDM question, I am a younger member in Alateen and I would not have made it if it were not for the older Alateens in my group.
- Q. Miles Would like to attend Young at Heart Al -Anon meetings, if there are any. He is not comfortable in a regular Al-Anon meeting. Younger Al-Anons have different world views.

- Q. Nicole, D9 As a former Alateen would like to ask the Board to do Workshops on how to transition from Alateen to Al-Anon and how to get the older Alateens interested in starting a Young at Heart Al-Anon meeting. Let's have a safe place where younger Al-Anons can go other than their mother's Al-Anon meeting.
- Q. Enid, D17 Looking at the two handouts that were passed out, one states that the addendum to allow an Alateen member "over the age of 16" and the other states "Alateen member 17 or older". This is confusing. Which one is correct?
- A. Donna The correct wording on the Addendum should state "17 years [of age] or older."
- Q. Amelia, D45 Is it possible to consider llowing adults from 18-25 to become AMIASs?
- A. Bear That is a question that will be addressed in the future.
- Q. Arlene How many Young at Heart in Al-Anon programs have started since the last Assembly? She has seen no flyers advertising young meetings.
- A. Rob, YHA Chair The Committee has been spreading the word, but funds are limited which makes it difficult to get the word out. There are currently 5 Young at Heart Al-Anon meetings, three more than in May: one in Orange County, one in San Bernardino County, one in Los Angeles County and two in San Diego County. Eighty percent of members in these groups are under 25 years of age.
- Q. Suzanne, AACC There are specific *Guidelines* for Conventions. We have always had an Alateen as Chair of an Alateen Event. The Guideline states that this position should be held by an AMIAS and an Alateen can co-chair the event.

#### **Comments:**

- Lea Does not feel that the Alateens are respected.
- Ivette Does not agree with the decision, but is glad to see that there is a plan to transition the older Alateens.

- Arlene Is in favor of this and was grateful to hear the time a dedication that was put into this proposal.
- Vanessa We cannot do this alone. This is an opportunity to promote the young at heart Al-Anon groups.

#### Lunch break at 12:15pm

#### Meeting reopened at 1:15pm

**7th Tradition Update** – Tarisa report that that today's 7<sup>th</sup> Tradition was \$2,287. Yippie!!!

#### Concepts read by Libby, D75

#### **Old Business Continued:**

- Addendum to the May Assembly, 2018 Motion which lowered the age at which Alateens age out of Alateen from 20 to 18 continued:
  - Roll Call of all GRs in attendance was updated. Total of 207 voting GRs.
  - Are you ready to vote on the Addendum?
  - Donna A "yes" vote means you are ready to vote on the Addendum today. A "no" vote means the issue will be tabled until the next Assembly and the original motion would go into effect on January 1, 2019.
  - Ready to vote on Addendum was approved.
    95% in favor, 4% against and 1% abstained
  - Vote on Addendum All current Alateen Members 17 years of age and older as of January 1, 2019 will age-out on January 1, 2021 or their 21<sup>st</sup> birthday, whichever comes first.

Motion to accept Addendum was approved. 95% in favor, 5% against and 0% abstained.

#### • Area Alateen Resolution Committee (AARC) Report:

• Bear, AASC – Reported on AARC, ASBRs and SCAC updates. The team is working on all three of these areas.

#### New Business:

#### • Thought Forces –

Donna – A Thought Force is a group that is created to explore an issue for a short period of time. They could recommend an action and then a Task Force could be created to set policy and/or procedures.

#### • Assembly Thought Force:

Donna – A Thought Force is needed to look at all of the issues regarding our Assemblies: changing the location, the amount of time we meet, how often we meet, etc. We have the largest Area and the shortest Assembly.

#### • Area Insurance Thought Force:

Donna – Need to look at the possibility of the Area providing Insurance to cover groups.

- Q. Barbara Proposed a motion to vote today on an insurance policy. Their group has been meeting in the same place for more than 30 years. They are now homeless and need a new place, but have to have insurance. California North has an insurance policy with a rider in place that covers this. Our Area could purchase the same policy for up to two years and it could be implemented immediately.
- A. Donna- This would be the function of a Thought Force to see if it is possible. Donna suggested that Barbara be part of the Thought Force. If there were a couple of people with the knowledge on this Thought Force, it could be brought to the Officers within a couple of weeks. However, there needs to be a KBDM process and any costs over \$2,000 would have to go before the Board.

#### • Work Group –

Donna – Reported that Ben, Website Coordinator, is forming a Work Group to revamp the Area's website. Anyone interested in being part of this Work Group, contact Ben.

#### • Task Force for SCAC -

Donna - A Task Force to re-establish a safe SCAC is also needed. The soonest that SCAC could be reinstated would be 2020,

not 2019. There are several issues that have to be worked out. The recommendations arrived at by the Task Force would first be presented to the Officers, then to the Board and then to the Committee before going to the Assembly for approval.

Donna – There are sign-up sheets on the stage for anyone who is interested in being part of the two Thought Forces, there is a sign-up sheet here today. If you are computer literate and want to be part of the Website Work Group, see Ben after the meeting.

Donna – *Would like to take a* procedural vote today to see if we need to create a Task Force for SCAC.

#### • Questions and Answers:

- Q. Lea, D17 Are there any Alateens on this Task Force?
- A. Donna If you are interested, put your name of the sign-up sheet.
- Q. Nicole, D9 Will the Task Force be looking at an "overnights" in addition to SCAC?
- A. Donna That will be addressed by the Task Force.
- Q. Miles Would like to see Alateens on the Task force and everyone on the Task Force should be an AMIAS as well.
- A. Donna There is a place on the sign-up sheet that asks if you are an AMIAS, Alateen Sponsor or have attended SCAC.
- Q. Tina, D21 Who will be selecting this Task Force?
- A. Donna The Chair has the authority to select the Task Force, but will coordinate with the Officers and other Area Al-Anon members to make an informed decision. Anyone can sign-up. The deadline is not today. If anyone is interested, they can email their request to <u>alateen-amiasconcerns@scws-al-anon.org and they will be added to the list.</u>
- Q. Vicki, D72 Had a Workshop in their district and the focus was on Alateen. One of the main points was that older Alateens be encouraged to participate in the Young at Heart Al-Anon meetings.
- Q. Barbara, D17 An Alateen GR would be a great asset on the Task Force?
- A. Donna We could add that to the sign-up sheet as well.

- Q. Nancy, D12 Recommended that the Area draw from past SCAC sponsors to be on the Task Force.
- Q. Mia, D60 Has been on the SCAC Committee for the past two years and would like to see other members from the Committee on the Task Force.

Donna – Are we ready to vote to see if we want to create a Task Force to reinstate SCAC. It is not a motion, just a consensus.

Vote to create SCAC Task Force approved. 98% in favor, 1% against and 1% abstained

- A. Marcia The first place to look would be in your Service ManualAl-Anon/Alateen Service Manual

2018-2021. You can also go to the WSO website or look inside the publication to see the copyright date.

- Q. Why do we pay WSO staff to attend our Assembly?
- A. Eva WSO pays their own way to TEAM Events. If we invite someone from WSO to attend our Assembly, we are responsible for their travel and lodging expenses.
- Q. A member was wearing a political hat at our meeting. After the meeting, he was asked to not wear his hat in the meeting. He stated he could wear anything he wanted in the meeting.
- A. Marcia The group did the right thing about not having the discussion during the meeting. This could be addressed at the meeting level to go over the guidelines as to what is appropriate attire at a meeting. Bottom line, we have no control over what others decide to wear.
- Q. Why is it required to provide your Social Security Number to become an AMIAS?
- A. Eva At the last Assembly, it was voted upon to provide your SSN to meet the ASBRs.
- A. Laura, AAPP Your SSN is required, but the Area does not collect your SSN. It is submitted to Trak 1, the company which is conducting the background checks.

#### Representatives District and Al-Anon announcements -

Tracey, D9 – Launched a new meeting in her district and was able to find information on the WSO website as to how to send out notification to several agencies.

Tina, D21 – North Hollywood has a rack in their Police Department with Al-Anon information. Last term, their DAL was able to get Al-Anon's phone number into the 211 directory for the Los Angeles County Policy Department. Although Al-Anon is in the Police Department database, most officers are not be aware of this resource.

# Delegate

#### Recent Email Communication from our World Service Office (WSO)

Area members asked these questions below. Sue Perez, WSO Associate Director-Group Services, was consulted regarding the questions/answers.

1. Q. Is it all right to use older editions of the Service Manual for group (and District) business, group readings, etc.?

Previous Service Manuals are outdated A. and do not reflect current policy or practice. In our current version on the first page, it states: "This 2018-2021 edition of the Al-Anon/Alateen Service Manual (P-24/27) replaces any previous editions."

2. Q. My meeting uses old hand typed copies of the suggested Welcome, Preamble to the Twelve Steps, the Steps, Closing, and other Conference Approved Literature (CAL) such as Understanding Ourselves, Three Obstacles to Success, etc.

Use of typed copies of Conference A. Approved Literature is a violation of copyright as outlined in the Policy Digest section of "Conference Approved Literature and Service Tools/ Materials" beginning on page 110. By

using the actual CAL we maintain the integrity of the written, copyrighted words found therein. ["Groups at Work"(p-24) copies are a great alternative.

Additional Note: Before we had Service Manuals with the design/layout that we use now, meetings often used notebooks with typed copies of Al-Anon materials. Reference to these "copies" can be found in Many Voices, One Journey, p. 165. "In 1972, the Executive Committee voted to insert mimeographed sheet into all copies in stock of Al-Anon and Alateen Groups at Work. This sheet included the revised Preamble to the Twelve Steps, the Suggested Welcome, and the new Suggested Closing. This sheet was included in the packets for new groups, and also mailed in October to groups, along with a Beginner's Meeting Format."

3. Q. I attended a group that used the 1960's edition of *Living With An Alcoholic* (B-5) as the source for all readings during the meeting. Is this recommended?

A. There is no set policy regarding use of CAL literature that is discontinued/no longer in print. What members share is that the experiences expressed in this earlier literature are not reflective of today's issues with families of alcoholics. Page 110 of the "Policy Digest" refers to the purpose of creating CAL as new material and revisions of material.

#### July 2018 Chairperson of the Board (COB) Letter

"The purpose of this Chairperson of the Board letter is to share highlights from our 2018 International Convention and the July 2018 Board Week. You will also find updates from our Policy Chairperson, a finance update from our Treasurer and a Conference Leadership Team (CLT) update." (The complete COB letter can be found on the WSO website, alanon.org, Members, Board of Trustees page.)

# The following are some of the highlights from the COB letter:

- The 2018 International Convention attendance records were broken with 4,044 attendees. The next International Convention will be held in Albuquerque, New Mexico in 2023.
- The Board of Trustees approved the following Motions:
  - 1. To approve a special project to provide professional interpretation, when required, to support Spanish-and

French-speaking Delegates who attend the World Service Conference.

Marcia's Extra Note: At the 2018 World Service Conference (WSC) there was a Delegate whose primary language was French. He could understand English, however he was not as fluent/comfortable communicating in English as he would have been in French.

2. That the Board of Trustees directs the World Service Office to send a statement alerting all registered groups on the importance of discussing and creating safety guidelines.

*Marcia's Extra Note*: There has also been a request to the WSO Literature Committee to create a pamphlet regarding safety, addressing issues both outside and inside of our meetings.

3. That the Board of Trustees direct the WSO Staff to utilize the Policy Committee criteria presented at the 2012 World Service Conference to ensure that an Area has established a fair and balanced "Do Not Refer" and "Re-Refer" policy. These criteria allow the WSO to support Area "Do Not Refer" group conscience decisions and remove group meetings from the WSO meeting list. Groups not being referred by the WSO remain active and registered.

Marcia's Extra Note: Each Area may create their own "Do Not Refer/Re-Refer" Policy based on the 2012 Policy *Committee's* criteria. The Southern California World Service (SCWS) Area created a "Do Not Refer/ Re-Refer" policy that was approved by the Assembly Nov. 2016. The Southern California Policy For **Resolving Group and Member Concerns** can be viewed on our SCWS website, scwsselecting "Assembly al-anon.org. bv Presentations", and scrolling to the bottom of the page- "Task Force for Resolving Group and Member Concerns". Our Policy was sent to WSO for review Sept. 27, 2018. After our Policy is reviewed/approved by WSO, we will have WSO's support for future Area "Do Not Refer" decisions. If a group is placed in "Do Not Refer" status, they will still remain "active", with a voice

and vote at the Area and Al-Anon Information Service (AIS) level. However the group is removed from AIS/Intergroup and WSO directories. There is a provision (and procedures to follow) in our Policy for a group to submit a request to be "relisted" (Re-Refer).

- At-Large Committee Members: WSO is accepting résumés for *Forum* Editorial Advisory Committee (FEAC), Literature, Public Outreach and Audit. Deadline: Jan.1, 2019. At Large members can live anywhere. Link to the résumé (and requirements) found in COB letter (Ten continuous years in Al-Anon and not a member of AA).
- Membership Survey, 2018: posted on alanon.org/surveyresults; there is a PowerPoint.
- **Financial Update**: available in COB letter; contributions increased in September, however we are still behind for budgeted contribution goals.

# Chair

Greetings!

We received lots of feedback from members on the Evaluation Forms at the May Assembly (and thank you to everyone who filled them out!), many of which were about the timing and process of using Knowledge-Based Decision-Making (KBDM) for voting on recommendations. Based on that feedback, the Officers and Board members discussed adopting the procedure outlined below, beginning with the November Assembly. We will refine the process over time.

- Any issues brought before the Assembly for a vote will be presented in the morning, prior to our lunch break.
- The presenting body making the recommendation will be required to have posted on the SCWS website *four weeks prior to the Assembly* a report of their KBDM process and how they decided on the recommendation they're presenting to the Assembly.
- After this presentation at the Assembly (which will include the "framing" or history and background of the issue, how the body answered the 5 KBDM questions, and the cons of the resulting pros and recommendation), the question and answer portion of KBDM will take place. As in the past, the time for members to ask questions and give comments will be timed-either one minute or two minutes at the microphone, with a half-hour set aside for each KBDM segment. The estimated time for a presentation will be  $1\frac{1}{2}$  hours.
- After lunch, there will be a brief time (5 to 10 minutes) for any unique questions or comments that came up during lunch which were not included in the discussion prior to the lunch break.
- A vote will then be taken to *see if the GRs are ready to vote on the issue*. This will require "substantial unanimity"—a vote of 2/3rds of the GRs, rather than a majority vote
- If the voting GRs decide that they are ready

to vote, we will then vote on the recommendation at that time.

- If the voting GRs decide that they are *not* ready to vote, we will table the motion until the subsequent Assembly. Any questions and comments relevant to the issue from that day's Assembly discussion will be added to the presentation on the Area website.
- The issue will be placed on the subsequent Assembly's Agenda. All of the background information from the website will be reviewed when it is brought up at the following Assembly. The GRs will be asked if there is any new information (unique and new questions or comments) to add to the discussion. We will then have a vote on the issue.

It is our hope that these changes in the procedures will ensure that our members have the opportunity to learn about and become familiar with issues prior to the Assembly. It will also afford GRs the opportunity to talk to their group's members about such issues, to see if their members have opinions, feedback, or questions about the issues. It will help to ensure that GRs don't feel "rushed" into voting but will have the time to digest the presentation and discuss it over lunch. And they will get to decide whether or not they feel prepared to vote that day. It is our hope that this new procedure will encourage more participation and create more unity and harmony.

# Treasurer

I want to thank all of the groups, districts, and conventions that send contributions to Southern California World Service. Your contributions allow SCWS to carry the message of Al-Anon Family Groups throughout Southern California.

**Summary of Quarterly Financials:** The total revenue for Oct-Dec 2018 increased 13% *compared to Oct-Dec 2017*. The total expenses decreased \$14,838.21 *compared to Oct-Dec 2017* because \$15,000 was contributed to WSO in 2017. Our net

revenue for the 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter of 2018 was \$5,586.84. We continued to maintain a reserve of \$35,000.

**Summary of 2018 Annual Financials:** The total revenue was \$ 82,744.81. The total expenses was \$77,483. We earned interest income of \$68.55, which resulted in a Net Revenue of \$5,330.04. Training expenses of \$2,800 that should have been paid in 2018 will be reimbursed in 2019, which leaves a surplus of \$2,530.04 for the year.

**To DRs & GRs:** Your meeting (for GRs)/district (for DRs) should reimburse you up to 100 miles *roundtrip* to attend the Assembly. If you drive 101 miles or more *roundtrip*, SCWS will reimburse you \$0.40 for each mile exceeding 100 miles. Please submit your reimbursement request forms to the SCWS Treasurer at the Assembly.

If you travel 200 miles or more *roundtrip* to attend the Assembly, SCWS will reimburse \$100 per person for your hotel room. Your meeting (for GRs)/district (for DRs) should reimburse you the remaining amount. Please include this amount on the reimbursement form and provide a copy of the receipt.

**To Group Treasurers:** PLEASE, PLEASE, PLEASE write your group's WSO ID# on the check or money order when sending your contribution. This ensures that your group receives credit for the contribution on the quarterly report! If you do not know your Group ID#, write the Day, Time, City, Zip Code, and Group Name on the check so I can look through the database to find your Group ID#. In addition, please provide a LEGIBLE EMAIL so your receipt can be emailed.

It is greatly appreciated when you include a contribution form with your check or money order! It helps expedite the processing of your contributions and makes this task much easier for me. The Group Contribution Form can be downloaded from the Get Forms webpage of the SCWS website, which is *www.scws-al-anon.org/scwso\_forms.php*. Districts and Conventions can also use this form.

# Ask-it-Basket

## Question 1:

What does it mean when the Area "recognizes" a convention? What are the requirements?

#### Answer 1:

The following conventions are "recognized" by Southern California World Service (SCWS): Southern California AA Convention (SCAAC) with Al-Anon participation; Southern California AFG Convention; Southern California Alateen Conference (SCAC-Suspended). The Al-Anon Chairpersons for these conventions act as liaisons, and have "voice" at the Area Assembly, and "voice" and "vote" at the Area World Service Committee (AWSC) meeting.

These recognized SCWS Area Conventions encompass all of Southern California. They are not specific to a city or a county. For example, the Orange County AA Convention with Al-Anon participation would not be recognized as an Area Convention, because it is specific to a Southern California County.

When the Young-at-Heart Al-Anon (YHA) Committee requested permission to be recognized by the Area and use the Al-Anon name for their Convention, they first contacted the SCWS Area Officers. From there, they gave a presentation to the SCWS Board, the AWSC, then to the SCWS Assembly. At the May 2018 Assembly, Group Representatives voted and approved the YHA's request for a three-year-trial period. YHA is now a "recognized" event.

#### Question 2:

Why do AMIAS need to provide their Social Security Number as part of their background check?

#### Answer 2:

This new policy that came into effect on January 1, 2019 is the result of Task Force recommendations at the May 2013 Assembly, to come up with a more rigorous background check on Area AMIAS. Group Representatives voted and approved the motion. After exhaustive research and much deliberation, the following recommendations were proposed at the May 2018 Assembly: that the Area will continue to use Trak-1 for background checks and to use the background check that requires Social Security Numbers.

Because the SSN is such a sensitive piece of personal information, the Area implemented an online process that allows members to input their information directly into Trak-1's secure website. The SSN is used only to verify identity and past addresses to conduct a proper search.

#### Question 3:

Is there a list of Alateens on the SoCal Speaker Circuit?

#### Answer 3:

The Area Safety and Behavioral Requirements (ASBR), prohibit the names and contact numbers of Alateens to be published. It is suggested that members contact their District Representatives (DR) or District Alateen Liaisons (DAL) to inquire about Alateen Speakers.

#### Question 4:

I read that Districts are autonomous but I don't see that in the Steps, Traditions, or Concepts. Please clarify "districts are autonomous"?

#### Answer 4:

According to G-15 District Guidelines, "Regular meetings may be held monthly, bimonthly or quarterly--this is up to the autonomy of the District."

Districts, like Groups, elect its officers from among the GRs. Additionally, Districts maintain and manage their own checking accounts. And like Groups, Districts have the autonomy to decide how to disburse funds to the different service arms.

#### **Question 5:**

Are men's or women's meetings "closed" to the opposite sex?

#### Answer 5:

According to the *Al-Anon/Alateen Service Manual 2018-2021, p. 29,* "The WSO will register groups that are designated for men, women, parents, adult children, young adults, other gender identification/sexual orientation, etc. with the understanding that, in keeping with Traditions Three and Five, the group will welcome anyone affected by someone else's drinking."

On Page 30 of the *Al-Anon/Alateen Service Manual 2018-2021*, it further states as follows:

All Al-Anon Family Group meetings welcome anyone who believes that his/her life has been affected by someone else's drinking, either currently or in the past. An Al-Anon meeting may choose to be "**open**" or "closed" by the consent of its participants.

**Open** Al-Anon meetings allow attendance by people who are not families and friends of alcoholics, but who are interested in learning about Al -Anon Family Groups. People who may come to open Al-Anon meetings occasionally include students and professionals who work with alcoholics and their families.

**Closed** Al-Anon meetings are limited to members and prospective members, giving them the freedom to share and listen to the experience, strength, and hope of one another on a confidential and anonymous basis.

#### **Question 6:**

Where can we find a list of the most updated editions of Conference Approved Literatures (CAL)?

#### Answer 6:

A list of current Conference Approve Literature (CAL) can be found online at the following URL:

#### **Question 7:**

A Member wears a hat with a political message on it to the meeting. The member was asked to help keep outside issues outside of the meeting. But the member maintains that he can wear whatever he wants to the meeting. Please clarify.

#### Answer 7:

"Al-Anon is not allied with any sect, denomination, political entity, organization, or institution; does not engage in any controversy; neither endorses nor opposes any cause." (Suggested Al-Anon Preamble to the Twelve Steps, Al-Anon/ Alateen Service Manual, 2018-2021, pg. 13)

This statement refers to Al-Anon as a whole, such as Groups, Districts, Areas, and the worldwide fellowship. Individual members make their own choices regarding their political affiliation. There is also no dress code for Al-Anon members. Groups cannot dictate what another member should or should not wear. "The only requirement for membership is that there be a problem of alcoholism in a relative or friend." (Tradition Three).

#### **Question 8:**

A Group Representative brought in literature from an agency, claiming that SCWS makes an exception during September Recovery Month?

#### Answer 8:

Al-Anon does not formally recognize "Recovery Month," and "Recovery Month" is not directly related to Al-Anon/Alateen.

"To keep Al-Anon's message in focus and encourage unity, only Al-Anon/Alateen Conference Approved Literature (CAL) and Al-Anon/Alateen service tools are displayed, distributed and used at Al-Anon and Alateen meetings, including meetings at conferences and conventions. These items reflect the informed group conscience of the Al-Anon Family Groups as expressed by its World Service Conference since 1961." *Al-Anon/ Alateen Service Manual 2018-2021, Digest of Al-Anon/Alateen Policies p. 112.* 

#### **Question 9:**

*Why do we pay for a WSO Staff to come to the Area?* 

#### Answer 9:

In the spirit of 7<sup>th</sup> Tradition, the Area pays for airfare and lodging when a guest, including a member of the World Service Office (WSO), is invited to the Area to speak. However, during TEAM Events, the World Service Office (WSO) usually pays the staff's expenses.

#### **Question 10:**

Is there a repercussion to a member signing a liability waiver.

#### Answer 10:

According to the Al-Anon/Alateen Service Manual 2018-2021, p. 58: "Laws differ from place to place and it is suggested that groups contact someone in their locale regarding liability insurance."

# **Coordinator Reports**

# Al-Anon Information Service /Literature Distribution Center Coordinator

## Archives

Announcement of plans for the annual SOS (Sharing of Service Workshop) in January 2019 suggests a look back into the Area Archives to see how it all began. As the World Service Office says in its written guidelines (G-30) for Area Archives: "One of the best ways to protect the future of the Al -Anon fellowship in an Area is to look to the past." The first SOS was in 1975, when it was more like a convention than a workshop. It kicked off at 8:30 p.m. on Valentine weekend at the Edgewater Hyatt House in Long Beach, then continued with a fullday (9 a.m. to 9:30 p.m.) of programs and entertainment on Saturday, and concluded Sunday morning with breakfast and a wrap-up meeting. A report on the SOS said that 545 members registered for the SOS, and 400 Al-Anon members participated in workshops where attendance was divided by District number into groups of 100. The theme was "Come Alive in 75." The chair was Elsie Q., Area Delegate. With that strong foundation for the event, the Area planned its second annual SOS, also a three-day affair, with a theme of "Reality in Al-Anon." Registration was \$1, and the fee for the event's three meals was \$13. The program for the event was obviously created on someone's typewriter, then mimeographed. No computers, just those difficult old mimeograph stencils! Betty R., Area Delegate, was chairman of the opening meeting. Looking back at Area records is fun. Here's hoping someone in your District is keeping a record (or archives) of your events. Computers, thumb drives, scanners, and the Cloud all make it easier.

# **Area Alateen Processing Person**

Our Area continues to gain new AMIAS at a rate of 2-3 average per month. The offer stands that a special training webinar will be held for any group of 3 or more, either in the same location, or at the same time. Please contact the AAPP to ensure availability.

In October 2018 we began the endeavor to get our Area in compliance with the mandate of the vote in May 2017 that by 1 January 2019 all AMIAS will have a criminal background check that requires submission of the Social Security Number. In order to maintain the security of our members and remove liability from the Area, we shifted in July 2018 to a method called "Self-Apply," whereby the members input their information directly to the secure website of Trak-1, instead of writing it on a piece of paper that would be maintained by the AAPP. This new process guarantees that this sensitive piece of personal information (ie the SSN) is never seen by anyone in SCWS, not as part of the application nor in the report we receive.

The initial sweep was of AMIAS who had no record of background check at all, and of those whose background check was more than 5 years old. Of the approximately 180 people initially contacted, we have about 70% compliance. At present, there are 38 AMIAS with no record of background check and 16 with background check more than 5 years old. The AAPP will follow up with those individuals and with the DR/DAL of the Districts in which they serve to try to bring them into compliance by the end of the month. We have an issue where a member complained to WSO that our process of background check violates Al-Anon's 12<sup>th</sup> Tradition of Anonymity. The complaint was based on their reading of Trak-1's generic Disclosure Statement that described the most extensive "investigative" pre-employment background check. The legal Disclosure Statement that Trak-1 posted to our portal did describe a process that would have been a violation of our Traditions ... IF it were the process that SCWS actually was attempting. In fact, the type of scan for which SCWS actually has contracted - a scan of the national sex offender registry and county criminal databases - is in keeping with the Trustees' mandate to maintain the safety of our Alateens and is within our 12<sup>th</sup> Tradition.

Prior to the complaint to WSO, the problematic language of Trak-1's Disclosure Statement had already come to light and was being addressed. As of 18 January, 2019, a revised version of the Disclosure Statement, which accurately describes the type of background check that SCWS is paying for, along with assurances of protection of our members' confidentiality and anonymity, has been posted to the SCWS portal of Trak-1. It was never the case that we were violating our members' anonymity, but the appearance was to the contrary. The Area has taken measures to alleviate the appearance of this discrepancy, and will make effort to communicate both the nature of the error (i.e. failure to adequately scrutinize the Disclosure Statement posted to our portal for our members to read) and its correction. The topic will be addressed at the Committee Meeting in February 2019 so that DRs will understand accurately what transpired and can help disseminate the correct information to our members and put their minds at ease that their anonymity is protected at the same time we endeavor to put forth a reasonable effort to protect the safety of our Alateens.

Annual AMIAS Recertification Process -

The schedule for AMIAS recertifications is complete and available on the SCWS website

#### DR, DAL & AIS Alateen Coordinator Training-

This is the next project I will be undertaking once the Recertification process is underway. I hope to have training available by this summer. I am not sure what format it will be but I am open to ideas. Also, I am open to entertain anything that you feel might be of importance to include in the training. If you have any please contact me.

#### AMIAS Background Checks -

We have been getting many questions about this process. We have recently changed the background process for AMIAS's following a task force recommendation and approval by the Group Representatives in Southern California. Social Security Numbers are required in order to obtain the information needed to certify each AMIAS. In the past there was an option to complete a more limited background check without submitting a social security number. The task force determined that we do not get the necessary information without it.

Identifying information necessary for the background is entered by each individual AMIAS directly to Trak-1, the agency that conducts the background check. This was done in order to get the information that is required for AMIAS certification, and to limit the possibility of identifying information including social security numbers falling into the wrong hands.

So we are requiring all newly certified AMIAS's to complete the new process which is done using a link directly to Trak-1. That way there is no need for Alateen coordinators or any other unauthorized individual to gain access to AMIAS social security numbers or other identifying information. In addition we are having existing AMIAS's complete background checks for the following reasons:

- Long term AMAIS's who have never had a background check completed
- AMIAS's who opted out of submitting Social Security during their certification process
- AMIAS's who have not had a background check within the past 5 years.

Moving forward, all active AMIAS will have to complete the background at least once every 5 years. Because of the large number, we are catching up on background checks in phases. If you have not received an email with a link to complete the background check, you are not in one of these categories, or we have not reached that specific phase yet.
