DELEGATE'S REPORT

Greetings CA(S), Area 04! Thank you everyone for the opportunity to attend the Al-Anon International Convention in Vancouver, Canada. I came back from the Al-Anon International Convention refreshed, renewed, recharged and ready for the next adventure in Southern California Al-Anon! It was truly an amazing experience celebrating "worldwide unity". The connection of meeting old friends and making new friends from all over the world, sharing recovery and gratitude was "The Spiritual Journey of Changing Me to We" come alive.

I hope that each of you is already saving for the next Al-Anon International Convention in Baltimore, Maryland in 2018!

The new book released at the International Convention is titled: Reaching for Personal Freedom. It is a spiral workbook on how to work the Steps, Traditions and Concepts in our lives. The questions are thought-provoking and I already have started to use it for myself and my sponsees!

Let's all remember to remind our Literature Chairperson at our meetings that there are many, many books available in Al-Anon. There are times I attend meetings and all they are selling are our three meditation books. We have a wealth of information in our literature, so let's sell all of them at all our meetings. My motto is if we have the books available they will buy them!

The new Conference theme has been announced in the Chairman of the Board (COB) letter that I recently received. The new theme for 2014 is "World Service Conference: Our Spiritual Principles in Action".

Conference Summaries:

The Conference Summary from the April 2013 Conference is available electronically on the members' website. It can also be ordered through your Literature Centers. An individual copy was given to each member of the SCWS Committee at the meeting on Saturday, August 17.

Electronic Literature Update:

The Forum is still planned to go electronic and is in process. When released it will be available on the Nook, Kindle and iTunes.





Having Had a Spiritual Awakening was the first book available to the fellowship electronically and the sales are progressing. As of July 31, the number of e-books sold is 1,338. The new Al-Anon Alateen Service Manual 2014-2017 will be available in English on line on the members' website October 1, 2013. It will be postal-mailed to each registered Al-Anon and Alateen group in the U.S. and Canada with a Current Mailing Address (CMA) in early 2014.

<u>SCAC 2013</u>

I attended SCAC for the first time in June! I actually survived the weekend (physically) and I have such gratitude and love for the Alateens. I will return in 2014. The SCAC Bylaws were passed unanimously! The Alateen that made the PowerPoint presentation to the Alateens at SCAC used KBDM! It was fantastic. He had contacted me and requested information regarding what had worked in the past for Southern California World Service (SCWS) and what had not worked. He wanted to frame the information prior to the vote. He also wanted to know about the process used at the WS Conference when the Delegates are discussing a policy change topic. I told him that the Conference Chairperson asked that Conference members consider the following in reviewing the changes to policy:

- Is it accurate?
- Does it provide clarity?
- Can you live with it?

He did a superb job. First he asked the Alateens that had participated in helping to write the Bylaws to stand for recognition. It allowed the Alateens at SCAC to see that the Bylaws were mostly written by the Alateens.

It was a moment of complete spirituality watching the Alateens vote unanimously to pass the Bylaws that required that the Area have oversight of the Conference and that they follow the Area's Safety and Behavioral Requirements! I was in awe!





TEAM EVENT:

We are requesting that everyone SAVE THE DATE for our TEAM Event in January 2014. We have asked Conventions, Round Ups, Intergroups and Districts to please hold the date for this event. We want everyone to be a part of it. Ric B., WSO Executive Director, Marilyn M., WSO Canada-West Regional Trustee, and Pat Q., WSO Associate Director of Communications – Public Outreach/Media will be here. We have some exciting topics for that day and they will be announced on a later flyer.

LETTER TO SPANISH-SPEAKING GROUPS:

In July, all Spanish-speaking Groups were sent a letter discussing why the Groups should be purchasing their literature from local Literature Distribution Centers (LDCs) instead of from another structure (country). The letter also was sent in both English and Spanish to all Group Representatives (GRs) who represent Spanish-speaking groups.

The letter was written in response to some inquiries received at the World Service Office (WSO) about updates in the Al-Anon literature. Some Spanish-speaking groups asked why updates to Spanish translation of the Conference Approved Literature took so long.

The World Service Conference (WSC) has authorized the World Service Office (WSO) to be the sole publishing agency for the fellowship worldwide. Spanish-speaking groups in the U.S. and Canada are part of the World Service Conference structure and should purchase literature from that structure. The slow turnover of inventory indicates that many groups in the structure do not buy CAL in the U.S.

Purchasing CAL from the WSO supports the structure that serves the groups directly. WSO prints for its structure to supply its registered groups. Updates are made prior to each printing. When Spanish literature is not bought at the WSC by the groups the WSO serves, the publication does not get updated because the books are sitting in the WSO warehouse unsold! It is important that all Spanish-speaking structures, including Mexico, buy from the WSO. Spanish-speaking GSOs reprint from the current version of the literature; they cannot create their own updates until the WSO makes the changes. If you would like more information on this topic please don't hesitate to contact me.





CONTRIBUTIONS:

What do we need to communicate to members so they realize that their giving is as much a part of their gratitude and spiritual connection to the program as any other service opportunity? It is not what the Group gets but what the Group is a part of and what it costs for the Group to be a full participant in those efforts that is important. How can you (we) put a price tag on what we have been given in this program?

Concept One talks about the responsibility of the Groups for Al-Anon's world services. That responsibility includes financially supporting the services that our WSO provided to the Groups. Every service provided by WSO and SCWS benefits the Groups. The WSO spends \$253 per Group on services. Some of those services are: Group Services, Membership Outreach, Fellowship Communications, Public Outreach, Administration and Business Services.

SCWS also provides services to the Groups and Districts. Let us consider only one item, Alateen Certification and Recertification. There are internet costs for the certification process, mileage, purchase of literature for the workshops, location expense for the workshops, background checks, Audio Visual, etc., the list is endless!

What is important is that the Groups are informed about all these services and experience has shown that when Al-Anon groups are informed they are better able to make principle-based decisions.

Currently my most important activities center around the January 18, 2014 TEAM (Together Empowering Al–Anon Members) Sharing of Service event, which will be held at the Glendale Methodist Church on Saturday, January 18 from 9 am to 5 pm. Jayme C, Truck S. and I had our first conference call with the three people who will be our guest presenters for the event: Ric B., World Service Office (WSO) Executive Director, Pat Q., WSO Associate Director of Communications—Public Outreach/Media and Marilyn M., WSO Canada– Western Regional Trustee.

We are in the process of developing the agenda, which will include "shared leadership opportunities." This means that various Al–Anon members from California South will participate in certain workshops along with the WSO presenters.

We have brought lots of copies of a Save-the-date flyer in English this morning. Please take them back to the GRs in your districts. One of the purposes of this early flyer is to alert Groups, Districts and Conventions so that they can avoid planning competing events on January 18. Thanks for helping to spread the word. We will e-mail a Spanish version of the Save-the-date flyer as soon as it is ready.

We will have final flyers ready well before the November Assembly. We will have a major registration drive at the Assembly to pre-register as many people as possible. It is important to note that the TEAM Sharing of Service event is for all Al-Anon members—not just members involved in World Service.

We will spend a few minutes at the Committee meeting discussing the summary of the District 64 Thought Force which was presented at the last Assembly. Whatever our Area and our Spanish-speaking groups eventually decide about how best to serve our Spanish-speaking members, input from our District Representatives will be essential.

Chair Report

We are trying a new seating arrangement for the Committee meeting today. We have an additional row of tables behind the main table where the voting members sit. If this works out we'll continue it.

I have said it before, we are the largest area in Al-Anon. This gives us many challenges. The biggest is time; we have roughly six hours per year of Assembly time to get the Area business done. I'll talk more later, but also will demonstrate today by limiting discussion. Discussion is important, but we need to pay attention to ongoing business as well. We have had the Book Fair, pink can campaign, archives projects, and many others ongoing that you need to hear about as well.

Concept eight: the board of trustees delegates full authority for routine management of Al-Anon Headquarters to its executive committees

Concept three: the right of decision makes effective leadership possible

For example: public outreach. You will hear three reports today about public outreach, but these three work together and with the Hispanic liaison and even with other Board members - the book fair for instance.

For example: we have an Alateen Resolution Committee, which deals with AMIAS issues and problems. (It used to be the officers, but now is more focused.) This helps us keep matters confidential - even the Resolution Committee is not told the names of the affected people. Because The Committee is more familiar with the requirements and procedures.

For example: AMIAS again. I'm going to steal her thunder Tarisa has been doing a great job with the sponsor training workshops, but our area is so large she really can't do it all. She'll introduce her committee of trainers today.

Because it's all important, I'm going to limit the time we spend at any one Assembly on any issue. If we don't finish the discussion, we'll carry it over to the next Assembly. I believe we needed to spend enough time discussing the Alateen Requirements, for instance, to come to the almost unanimous approval of them at the last Assembly. District 64 is another issue that we will need to spend time discussing and I want to make sure we take that time, but also make time for all the other important business.

I want to continue to thank all the groups that are consistently sending in group contributions to Southern California World Service. And a special thanks for your contribution for the Seventh Tradition at the Assembly last week. We collected \$921.71at the Assembly on May 18^{th} .

Our year to date contributions are up by 8.5% (as I write this report) compared with 2012 YTD group contributions. Our overall expenses are up by 218% compared to last year and this was due to recent events including sending seven board members to SWRDM and eight board members to SCAC, as well as equipment required for future Alateen Certification Workshops in 2014.

The Assembly on May 18, 2013, voted to send \$2,500 to WSO and we will review at the November Assembly to see if we can send an additional contribution. I mailed the \$2,500 to WSO on May 21st. The Assembly also approved our proposed budget of \$60,000 for 2013.

Reminder to all DRs & GRs: If you are driving over 100 miles to attend the Assembly, your meeting or district will reimburse you for the first 100 miles and SCWS reimburses you for miles exceeding 100 miles at forty cents a mile. This only applies to the person driving, and not members riding along. (Yes, I did receive a returned non-cashed check from a member that requested reimbursement, but was not driving; so I just want to clarify). All reimbursements are processed through our bank's bill pay system where the bank sends the reimbursement directly to the DR or GR at no cost to SCWS. Note the checks are only good for 90 days.

Congratulations to the ten winners of the Forum subscriptions at our May Assembly. Those subscriptions are in process and the winners should be receiving their Forum magazine soon.

• **<u>Reminder to Group Treasurers</u>**: When sending in your contributions to SCWS, **please use** the same Group ID assigned by WSO, versus the old numbering system. If you are not sure of your Group ID, contact our Group Records Coordinator, Chris Crawford. I have created a group contribution form, where the treasurer can download on to their computer and type directly on the form versus having to hand write the form. The form is also located on our SCWS website under "Forms."

SCAC update: SCAC By-laws have been revised and they were voted on at the 2013 SCAC and approved. SCAC lost the 501(c)3 status because paperwork was not filed. We are still waiting to receive the 501(c) 3 status back from IRS. Oversight of the SCAC bank account involves the SCWS Treasurer receives an email from the bank if there is a withdrawal >\$200, in addition to have online access to the bank account. There is \$17K in SCAC checking account. Sept 30 is the end of the current fiscal year for SCAC. Last Chance Picnic was Sunday, May 19th.

August AWSC

IT was great meeting some of the new DRs and ADRs, this morning. Welcome to the amazing world of service beyond the group level. I believe you will become inspired by the ideas you'll share, the new people you'll meet, the challenges you'll face and by the process of serving our meetings, districts, Area, and Al-Anon as a whole by way of what we learn and grow. Your service is so valuable.

The activity of our Thought Forces (ThF) continues with presentations evaluating the efficacy of the Spanish overlay District64. In November, we will hear from the Conference Structure ThF, as well as dealing with groups who operate outside the Traditions, and Task Force (TF) working to streamline and clarify certain Area procedures--elections and voting. This is all very exciting as we look for ways to improve the Assembly process.

I've decided that for the remainder of my term as Past Delegate, I want to take on some issues and offer clarification and try to answer the question, "why?" To that end:

• <u>"Chanting".</u> We've all been to meetings where after the closing prayer members pump hands reciting, "keep coming back," but continue with increasing long rounds of, "it works if you work it but it won't so do it 'cause you're worth it so do it...." Here's what World Service (WSO) says about it--it is not part of Al-Anon-Anon, it comes from Treatment Centers. Sometimes newcomers are very off- put by this, it can sometimes reinforce some people's idea that Al-Anon is a cult. Many groups have substituted the Al-Anon Declaration for the closing and this has helped stop the chanting.

• <u>"Al-Anon Promises."</u> WSO reminds us that Al-Anon literature is written by and for Al-Anon members as they share their experience, strength and hope. We need to remember that it is not policy. There is no text designated as the "Al-Anon Promises." Now, there is a section in the book, *Survival to Recovery which sounds like the Promises in the 12 Step portion on AA's Big Book, but* Al-Anon does not have a set of promises and has never used that designation.

- <u>Speaking at Al-Anon meetings.</u> It is assumed when a member is asked to be the main speaker at an Al-Anon meeting, they will share about their experiences of recovery in Al-Anon. On some occasions speakers decide to primarily share about other, outside things which do not include AlAnon. "Members Interested in Speaking" (G-1) is an excellent guideline for those who wish to share. If we are at a meeting where the speaker is sharing about their other programs, philosophies, treatment centers, diet, religion, political beliefs, etc., the meeting has the right to request that the speaker focus only on Al-Anon. In fact, it is the meeting's responsibility to make this correction.
- <u>Abundance.</u> Some see a financial statement and decide, "they have enough money, we don't need to donate. "OR, maybe an individual is unhappy about a Group Conscience decision and, punitively stop contributing to a service arm ("That will show them."). Many are unaware that the WSO provides services valued at over \$250 for <u>every</u> meeting whether they contribute or not. But think about it. Who gets hurt? What services will have to be cut? Actions taken by groups actually effect Al-Anon as a whole. A review of the Seventh Tradition will help explain the spiritual aspect of giving to ensure that our program will succeed and survive .







SCWS Committee Meeting August 17, 2013

1) Q. Can we get the reference to using CAL only instead of retyping formats from the Service Manual on the SCWS website (a link)?

A: Reading from retyped versions of our Conference Approved Literature (CAL) has created confusion and lack of unity from our fellowship's earliest days. There is a suggested format on pages 10-27 of Al-Anon Alateen Groups at Work 2010-2013. This format is also on pages 10-27 of the Service Manual. If a group uses the meeting format as published in the Service Manual, the group is more likely to stick with Al-Anon's 12 Traditions.

Our First Tradition explains that our common welfare should come first. Therefore, for the unity of the world-wide Al-Anon fellowship, all members and groups are asked to honor the Legacies as written, as they reflect the informed Group Conscience of Al-Anon around the world. When Groups begin distributing photocopies of books they are essentially becoming a separate publishing agent. Members can photocopy a single article of The Forum or a page or two from our CAL to use as a springboard for discussion at a meeting. These copies would only be used at that one meeting. When members begin distributing photocopies of our books, even in serialized format, they are essentially becoming a separate publishing agent.

2) Q. Can we get the Al-Anon WSO letter regarding Al-Anon Promises accessible on the SCWS web site?

A: No. There is nothing officially written to the fellowship from WSO regarding the "Al-Anon Promises". Al-Anon does not list anything in our literature as "promises" because the World Service Conference, Al-Anon's largest group conscience has not designated anything as such.

Members find hope and promise from many different sources. In recent years, some individual members have titled one such passage without permission as "The Promises of Al-Anon". This is a violation of the copyright. This action on the part of a few has given some members the mistaken impression that our fellowship as a whole has elevated this excerpt to the level of importance accorded our Steps, Traditions and Concepts. Separated from the context in which it was originally intended, the excerpt began gaining a life of its own.

In Al-Anon we offer each other our experience, strength, and hope. We don't make promises because each individual's needs and situations are different.

.3) Q. Will the WSO register an Al-Anon meditation meeting or an Al-Anon meeting that has meditation in its format?

A: The WSO appreciates members' efforts to carry the message and spread the word of Al-Anon's help and hope. However, the WSO does not register meetings that have guided meditations in their format or are meditation meetings.

An Al-Anon meeting on the topic of meditation is fine; there are many Al-Anon Conference Approved (CAL) readings on prayer and meditation as described in Step Eleven. A meeting that requires members to meditate in any form is not appropriate in an Al-Anon meeting. The literature, recordings, or other tools that an individual member decides to use when praying and meditating outside of the meeting are up to that person. Bringing any kind of outside resources, whether it is a religious book on prayer, a recording on meditation (whether it is religious or secular), or any other non-Al-Anon material would not be appropriate at Al-Anon meetings, including meetings at conventions and conferences.

Al-Anon is a sharing program and not a teaching program. More can be accomplished when members share their experience, strength, and hope on a single topic. Practicing a specific form of meditation in an Al-Anon meeting is not in keeping with our principles.

CAL provides a unified view of Al-Anon and Alateen and undergoes a rigorous process of review for adherence to Al-Anon principles. In a spirit of unity, only Al-Anon service tools are used and displayed at Al-Anon meetings. This policy is stated in the section titled "Use of Material at Al-Anon Meetings" on page 101 of the "Digest of Al-Anon and Alateen Policies" section of the 2010-2013 Al-Anon/Alateen Service Manual (P-24/27).

4) Q. Should the WSO Conflict Resolution Set be used at meetings in place of the Traditions?

A. As mentioned in Question 1 above, the suggested Meeting Format in both the Al-Anon Alateen Service Manual 2010-2013 and the book Al-Anon Alateen Groups at Work 2010 – 2013 recommend reading the Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions of Al-Anon at meetings. There is nothing to stop a meeting from reading from the Conflict Resolution Set since it is Conference-approved. An Al-Anon meeting on the Conflict Resolution Set would be fine too. The Service Manual asserts the primary importance of the Al-Anon Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions.

5. Q. Is the word "Qualifier" in any of our Al-Anon literature?

The word "Qualifier" is not found anywhere in Al-Anon's Conference Approved Literature (CAL). "Qualifier" is a clinical term used in rehabilitation facilities. It has no place in an Al-Anon or Alateen meeting. "Focus on the AlAnon interpretation of our program is strengthened when we avoid using professional terms and labels since they may confuse members by implying affiliation with certain persons or specific therapies." 2010-2013 Al-Anon/Alateen Service Manual (P-24/27), p. 117.

6. Q. Do you have any suggestions on how to handle long-timers who "stay" in "leadership" positions?

A. Tradition 2 tells us that "our leaders are but trusted servants; they do not govern."

Three Obstacles to Success in Al-Anon, which our Service Manual suggests we read at every meeting, tells us: "No member of Al-Anon should direct, assume authority, or give advice.... Any attempt to manage or direct is likely to have disastrous consequences for group harmony." Finally, on page 43 of the Service Manual we read: "Group officers rotate regularly. Rotation gives all members the privilege of serving."

If certain group members are not willing to rotate out of their service positions, it may be necessary to have a Group Conscience to discuss their disregard for Al-Anon Traditions.

7. Q. Can SCWS coordinate with participation at the Orange County Fair? OC Intergroup used to do this, but stopped a few years ago. Since SCWS did the LA Book Fair, can we consider the OC County Fair? AA was at the OC Fair but there was no Al-Anon booth to refer families and friends to.

A. This is exactly the sort of project our SCWS Public Information Coordinator—currently Richard Rosenthal—can help with. His e-mail address is in the Bulletin. He will work in an advisory capacity with Al-Anon members in OC who want to have a booth at the OC County Fair. Our PI Coordinator also has a banner which groups and districts can borrow for Public Outreach events.

8. Q. "Can SCWS or WSO provide proof that Al-Anon is a 501(c)3? The Church where we hold our meetings would like a copy of your non-profit status."

A. SCWS cannot share its non-profit number with local groups because SCWS does not have control over group funds like other national organizations such as the Boy Scouts or Girl Scouts. An Al-Anon group is autonomous in its group matters, thus regulations in the U.S. do not allow SCWS to provide "blanket" tax-exempt status for individual groups. An Al-Anon/Alateen group is NOT a "branch" or "chapter" of SCWS.

Page 110 in the Service Manual states "U.S. and Canadian regulations do not contain provisions under which Al-Anon could apply for blanket exemption for its Area committees or local groups, now or hereafter formed. Only central organizations that effectively control their chapters or local units can apply for group exemptions."

My mission is to ensure that all of the Alateen meetings in our Area are safe, remain focused on the Steps & Traditions, and are being run by Alateens (not dominated by Alateen Group Sponsors).

(1) AMIAS New Applicant Certification Training (on-line and face-to-face sessions)

There are on-line sessions once each month in English AND once each month in Spanish.

There are face-to-face sessions in English at four Conventions and a face-to-face session in Spanish in District 64.

(2) AMIAS Recertification Workshops

Prior to scheduling the 2013-2014 workshops, an email was sent to all AMIAS's (appx 570) asking for the day and time slot most convenient for them to attend an AMIAS Recertification Workshop. All responders (with the exception of 2) stated that Saturday from 10am – 2pm was the most convenient for them to attend.

There are 20 workshops scheduled throughout Southern California between June 1, 2013 and May 31, 2014. I divided the Area into 6 different regions, each having an AMIAS Training and Workshop Presenter for their region. The regions were divided as follows:

Ventura, Santa Barbara, San Luis Obispo, & Kern Counties (Districts 3, 6, 8, & 12)

My name is Chris C. and I am the Group Records Coordinator.

We currently have 1211 Active Groups in Southern California. This is an increase of 21 new meetings since May 2013. There are 47 groups listed with "No Mail" as their addresses are not current and they are not receiving "The Forum" magazine or group information via mail or email updates as well.

All of the Intergroup offices have agreed that each meeting needs to be registered with WSO prior to being listed in the local directory. This may have something to do with the fact that we have registered over 42 new meetings this year! With reference to the 47 "no mail" meetings, I have sent an email to several of the groups with a very limited response to my request. This is down from I believe 67 meetings!

Please note that it is the responsibility of the Group Representative to update the Group Records Coordinator with the current information. I would like to encourage everyone to go to the SCWS website <u>http://scws-al-anon.org/send mtg record updates.php</u> to update your meeting or to register a new meeting. update the information. This way you save yourself the cost of the stamp and the WSO Office in Virginia Beach is updated as well, so there is no longer a need to notify WSO in Virginia Beach, VA as we work on the same database Going online to update information or to add a meeting is the quickest and easiest way to.

When completing the Information form, please make sure to add your **full name and address including your zip code**. This information is very important, in that the database can only assign you to one meeting as a Group Representative. I have had to spend many hours making phone calls and sending emails just to find out the Group Representative full name and address.

I take this commitment to my heart and want to do the best job I can. However, when I only receive half of the information I need, it is very frustrating on my end in that I cannot complete my job. If I do call you and leave a message via voice mail or email, please be courteous enough to return my call or email.

During a telephone conference with other group coordinators, it was strongly suggested by the WSO that all groups update their records, even if the information has not changed.

Verification of e-mail addresses has become essential and should be accomplished on a regular basis since the WSO and Areas are increasingly communicating electronically with the groups. WSO has requested that members **not** use their work email address for their group. It was suggested during a recent telephone conference with other Group Records Coordinators that a group can have their own email address through gmail.com or yahoo.com. If a birthdate is needed for the application of the email address, it was suggested to use Lois birthdate of March 4th and the year 1951 for year Al-Anon started, i.e., the birthdate would be 3/4/1951.

Please make sure that your Current Mailing Address (CMA) for your meeting is updated. The CMA receives all mail from WSO as well as the "Forum".





The audio book is currently in pre-order status through Audible.com and Amazon.com. A sample chapter is available on those Web sites. It


