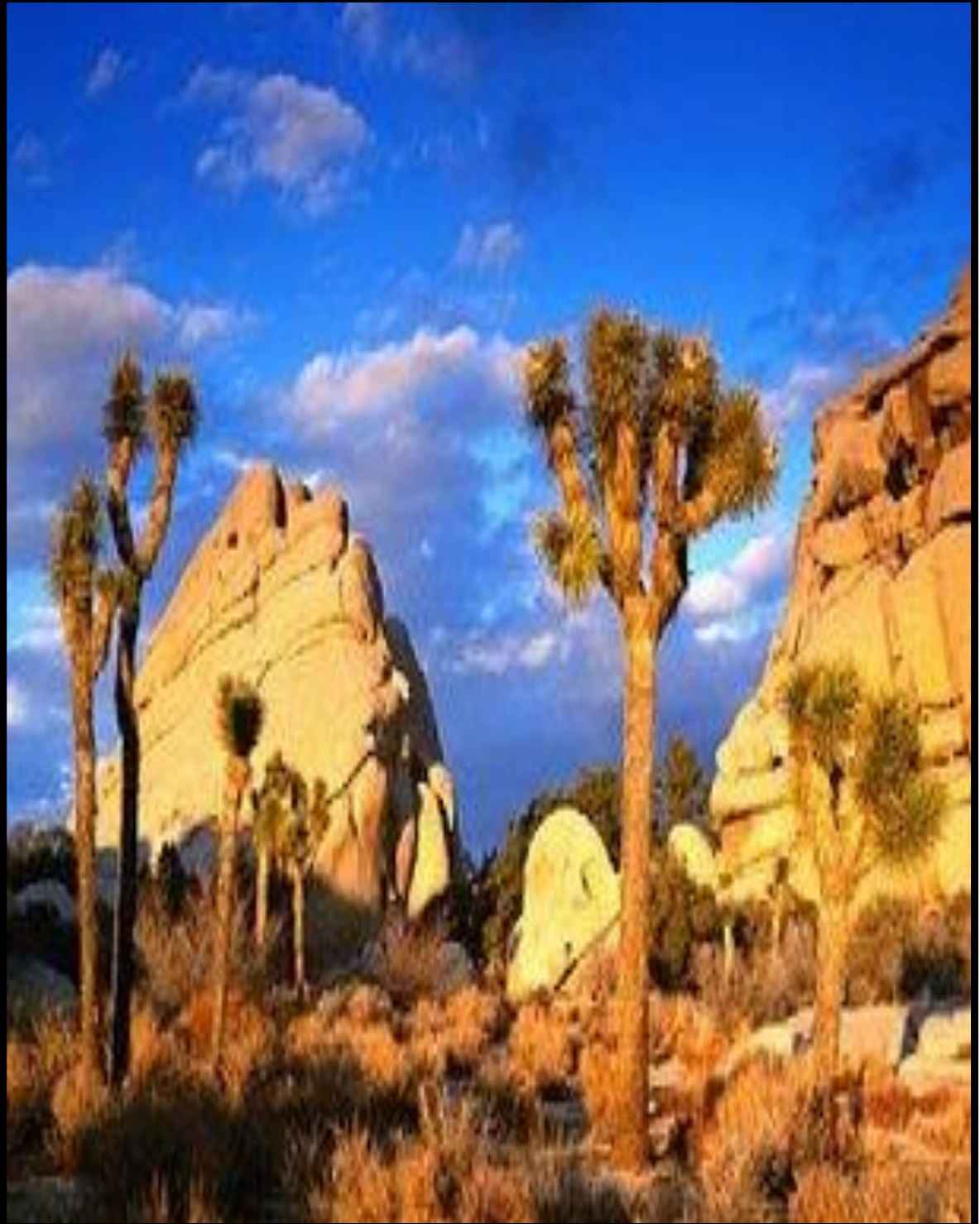

**CB Chair Report** - Welcome to the new DRs: Sasha S. D27, Libby A., D75

**Past Delegates present:** Jayme C., Panel 52; Sandie E., Panel 39.

**Roll Call - Records Coordinator** - Donna E. Absent: D10; D12; (no DR for D30); D51; D72; Elizabeth K. (late), Delegate; Eva B., Treasurer; Tarisa R.; Archives Coordinator Dan P.; CPC Coordinator; Inland Empire Liaison; San Diego County Liaison, Spanish Group, Ventura County Liaison, AFG.

**Secretary** – Sandy P. – Minutes Approval. Andrea D69, made motion to approve February 20, 2016 Committee Minutes; seconded by Marilen D66 and voted unanimously.

**Alternate Delegate** - Bruce G. – Will pass around Ask-It-Basket and Forum Can. Is in the process of developing a committee for SOS and will pass around a sheet for volunteers. Also passing around a list of suggested topics.

**Past Delegate** – Jayme C. - Reviews Conference Rules used at the WSC. Update on Task Forces: Age of Alateens has not gotten under way but working on it. The team is together and ready to start. Task Force on Groups Who Do Not Consider Al-Anon as a Whole will report in November. Clarification that no restructuring until D64 is finalized. Clarification about SCAC donations. 2016 SCAC funds are encouraged to be distributed to SCAC. Anything collected after June 1, 2016 it is suggested that excess monies be forwarded to SCAC. July 1<sup>st</sup> is fiscal year for SCAC. Bruce to clarify.

Jayme suggests when a loved one or friend dies and has Al-Anon literature, to check out the WSO site for suggestions on what to do with it.

Jayme went to a Chula Vista meeting doing a tremendous amount of public outreach. They wanted literature to take to traffic school and Jayme gave them suggestions that you don't have to spend a lot or do a lot to do public outreach.

Jayme speaks about WSO and deficit. Districts are allowed to contribute to WSO. It is up to Group's autonomy about how much they want to contribute. Bruce G. passed out Guidelines on Group Funds.

Jayme gets a lot of complaints about members not show-

ing up for their commitments. Thought Force on Members Who Do not Fulfill their Responsibility. (Get presentation from Jayme). Become familiar with the Service Manual and especially with Bill W's essay in Concept 9. Jayme does presentation and then opens for discussion. DR discusses a GR who does not show up for seven consecutive meetings. Discussion about Tradition One and the importance of unity of the group over good intentions of one member who habitually fails to show up at meetings. It helps to have a service sponsor. Some people are willing but not able to follow through. Bring the traditions, concepts, warranties into the conversation. Sometimes we over commit ourselves.

**Announcement** - CB announces that our Treasurer Eva was involved in a car accident and is okay, recovering. Previous Treasurer, Cathy S., will fill in until Eva gets on her feet.

#### **Delegate Report Aug 2016 AWSC Meeting**

At the Assembly meeting in May, we looked at the 2015 and 2016 WSO budgets, performed the skit and presentation from the WSO Task Force on Acceptance of Communities, Cultures and Beliefs, and heard some of the responses to the five questions of Knowledge-Based Decision-Making (KBDM) about the WSO Literature Committee's recommendation to the 2016 World Service Conference (WSC), which began the conversations in CA(S). The Conference voted to continue discussing it at the 2017 WSC after the Delegates have conversations about it with members in their Areas.

At today's Area World Service Committee meeting (AWSC meeting), we will get an update on the 2016 WSO budget, hear about more of the topics covered at the 2016 World Service Conference (WSC), view the PSAs that were shown at the WSC, and perform the skit and presentation of the Task Force on Communication and Strengthening the Links of Service.

All AWSC members will receive a copy of the *2016 World Service Conference Summary* today, first made available in June as a downloadable PDF file on the members website.

The *Highlights of the Conference Summary*, also became available in June on the members website. The "Highlights" is a new feature that allows members to read about a few of the topics covered at the Conference (WSC), to stimulate their interest in additional detail available from the Conference Summary.

Marsha W. was hired to fill the new position of Director of Programs, responsible for participating in the development, implementation, and evaluation of all WSO activities that serve members, and those activities that seek to attract new members who can benefit from affiliation with Al-Anon.

Districts have invited the Delegate to present additional Conference topics throughout the summer and fall in their neck of the woods. Twelve workshops on our Spiritual Potential have been planned by many Districts, either in groups or individually.

### **2016 WSO Budget**

See Feb 2016 Bulletin Delegate Report or members website for the 2016 WSO Budget.

The 2015 budget indicated a need for \$25 more **per group** in 2015 for the groups who contributed in 2014, which would bring 2015 contributions to \$1.7 million (up from \$1.5 million in 2014) and avoid transferring a projected \$52,000 from the reserves. The projected transfer amount was estimated from the difference between projected income and projected expenses for the services provided to the groups.

For many years this income has been 2/3 from literature purchases and 1/3 from contributions. Since literature purchases have declined severely, this decrease in income must be made up by increased contributions if we are to be able to provide the same level of services at the WSO.

Groups did indeed contribute more in 2015 than in 2014, but members bought far less literature than was projected. There was \$237,000 less in literature sales for 2015, whereas the budget had projected “only” \$10,000 less.

The 2016 WSO budget includes a more realistic continuing large decline in literature sales, a large transfer from the reserves (\$184,000), and it asks groups to increase contributions to \$1.8 million.

The May 2016 quarterly appeal letter asked for \$15 **per member** in 2016 and beyond, whereas the 2015 budget indicated a need for \$25 more **per group** in 2015. With this level of contribution, the WSO will be able to continue all of the services to groups and members at a cost of \$262 per group, whether a group contributes to the WSO or not.

The August 2016 quarterly appeal letter thanks members and asks them to continue their efforts, acknowledging that providing services to our fellowship requires a daily commitment. The second page lists many of the services provided to groups by the WSO.

To be fully self-supporting, we need to *increase our total contributions*. Some GRs have reported at District meetings that their groups voted to redistribute their contributions, which only would take away from one service arm (*SCWS, the District, and the AIS, Area Information Service – a.k.a. Intergroup office*) in an effort to support another (the WSO). Such a redistribution would not be self-supporting because it would not support our total needs of all of our service arms, each of which provides services to groups and members.

### **Workshop:**

#### **WSO Task Force on Communication and Strengthening the Links of Service**

WSO Task Forces are composed of Delegates, Trustees and World Service Office Staff.

This workshop is an exercise to encourage trusted servants to use spiritual principles as guideposts in communicating, while empowering the membership to use the links of service and make their needs known.

Workshop materials:

1. list of challenges and list of problems (below)
2. *Using Al-Anon Principles to Resolve Conflicts* Kit (K-70)
3. *Al-Anon/Alateen Service Manual*
4. Chart of spiritual principles and suggestions for effective communication

The AWSC divided into nine breakout groups, each brainstorming together about one of the “problems” and using one or more of the “challenges” to address the problem.

List of “challenges”

1. How can a Trusted Servant empower the group to address this problem keeping the spiritual principles in mind?
2. Think about the difference between “Chains of Servitude” and “Links of Service.” Is it the presence or absence of spiritual principles? Use this difference in solving your problem.



3. How can I communicate more effectively using spiritual principles?

4. What spiritual principles have been addressed and overlooked in this scenario, and how can I introduce pertinent spiritual principles into the discussion?

5. How can I help resolve a dispute or hostility using the spiritual principles provided in the Conflict Resolution packet?

List of “problems”

ONE. *My group does not want to hear the business discussion or announcements. They are always anxious for the meeting to start. I feel uncomfortable trying to share Area or district news with them. What should I do?*

TWO. *There are members of my group who are dominating. Sometimes they are bossy and even give advice. I told my Group Representative but she didn't do anything, so I am thinking of calling WSO.*

THREE. *A member is unhappy with others in his home group who often share about their membership and experiences in another Twelve step program. This home group member has voiced his concerns to his Group Representative, but it went no further. In frustration, the home group member sent an e-mail directly to the WSO to ask for guidance.*

FOUR. *A member of Al-Anon who is also a member of A.A. showed up at the district meeting. He wanted to announce a new group, though he was not a Group Representative. He did not know who has voice and vote, and spoke out of turn. Several people got upset afterward with the District Representative. They are threatening to step down from being Group Representatives.*

FIVE. *I make copies of the Area Highlights, Group e-News, and the Area Newsletter and bring them to the group, but somehow no one is willing to look at them or see any value in them.*

SIX. *At my Area Assembly, it was suggested that the Group Representatives share with their groups the importance of financially supporting the WSO. I feel we are not doing our part. How do I share this with my group?*

SEVEN. *My District Representative does not go to the Assembly, and has even discouraged the Group Representatives from going. He is very active in planning local events, often to the point of dominance. What can I do as a Group Representative?*

EIGHT. *Every quarter, the WSO sends a letter to be read at meetings, called the Quarterly Appeal. The suggestion is for this letter to be read at two consecutive meetings. After reading it at one meeting, the treasurer of the group announces that she doesn't want to take up any future meeting time, so she won't read it again.*

NINE. *Area job descriptions including eligibility, qualifications, skills, responsibility, time, and travel commitments are available to all members willing to stand for Area positions. After just a few months in the new position, the member is not re-*

*sponding to any correspondence, attending Conference calls, or fulfilling the responsibilities of the position.*

After a generous amount of time for involved discussion, one member of each group gave a report-back to the entire AWSC. The report-backs were detailed, interesting and thought-provoking.

## **Immediate Past Delegate**

Report for August 2016 Area World Service Committee Meeting (AWSC)

Greetings Southern California Al-Anon and Alateen. I am very grateful to serve as your Immediate Past Delegate.

At all Assemblies and Area World Service Committee Meetings (AWSC) a status report will be given of the on-going Task Forces in the Area. Currently, there are four Task Forces, one Work Group and we do not have any on-going Thought Forces.

The Task Force on Bylaw Changes will begin in September. It is comprised of all the CA(S) past Delegates who are currently active. Their charge is to assure that the SCWS Bylaws are current. The updated SCWS Bylaw will be brought forward at a later Assembly for a vote of the Group Reps.

The Task Force on Live Scan has completed its charge. It was a recommendation from the Area Alateen Safety and Behavioral Guidelines Task Force. Prior to August 2012 SCWS was using Megan's Law for background checks. Megan's Law only provided information if an applicant was a registered sex offender but not other felony convictions. Currently, we are using a background company called Trak-1. If a potential AMIAS provides their social security number, an in-depth report is given to SCWS from Trak-1.

SCWS has been approved by the Department of Justice (DOJ) for the use of Live Scan Background Checks. The new AAPP, Matt M. will be researching the different options with this process. The rolling fee varies based on the facility providing the service. Discussion will be needed with the Districts and Group Reps regarding costs. It now costs SCWS \$25 - \$35 for each potential new AMIAS to receive a background check. It could be substantially higher using Live Scan. Look for this to be future discussions in the Area.

The Task Force on Changing the Age of Alateens, Overnights and Special Needs was started because of the recommendation of the Area Alateen Safety & Behavioral Requirements

Task Force. This Task Force is due to begin the first of September.

The District 64 Task Force is an active working Task Force and they are working very hard toward a recommendation to the Assembly. This Task Force was born from the District 64 Thought Force. Their charge is to evaluate the 3 possibilities brought forth by the Thought Force. Those three possibilities are: (1) leave District 64 as is; (2) have several overlay Spanish districts; (3) have all the Spanish speaking Groups in District 64 aligned to their respective geographic districts. This Task Force is on-going and has not made any recommendations or decisions yet. That information will be presented at a future Assembly.

The Task Force on Groups Who Do Not Consider Al-Anon as a Whole is on-going. The charge was to create a Policy for Groups who do not follow the Traditions or consider Al-Anon as a whole. This is an active Task Force. They have consulted with other Areas that are already using a Policy and have also consulted with the WSO. This Task Force is scheduled to present the policy at the November 2016 Assembly.

The SCAC Work Group is a vital link between SCWS and SCAC. The face-to-face meetings are held quarterly and are an opportunity for members of SCWS (Area Treasurer, Area Alateen Sponsor Coordinator, AAPP, Delegate, Immediate Past Delegate and Past Delegate) and SCAC Committee (SCAC Chair, SCAC Co-Chair, SCAC Treasurer and SCAC Sponsors) to collaborate and collectively come up with resolutions to problems. Because the SCAC Committee and SCAC Chair and SCAC Sponsors change annually, it is a useful link to not lose the progress the Area has made in the past few years with SCAC.

SCWS has never had this working type of relationship with SCAC before and I cannot stress enough what a vital link it is for the Area and SCAC! Thank you everyone for your continued participation and dedication!

We are very excited to be using the electronic clickers at future Assemblies and Committee Meetings. We will have a few test votes today just for everyone to see how quickly the votes are counted!

I want to spend just a few minutes on a few calls I have received recently. Members calling because they are confused when hearing that the WSO has a deficit. What does this mean? Should my Group stop contributing to the other Service Arms and send all our money to WSO? The short answer is NO! The group supports Al-Anon financially at all levels of service by contributing to: their district, Al-Anon Information Service (AIS/Intergroup), SCWS and WSO.

There are many ways individual members can support the WSO financially. They are: personal direct contributions annually, automatic monthly deductions from your checking/savings account, on-line at the members' website: [www.al-anon.alateen.org/members](http://www.al-anon.alateen.org/members), subscribe to the Forum, buy a book, memorial contributions, birthday plan, combined giving campaigns, quarterly appeal, and bequests. Groups can be encouraged to have a Group budget and include WSO. It costs the WSO \$262.00 a year to support each Group or \$21.74 a

month per Group. Is your Group sending \$262.00 per year to the WSO? Is your Group subscribing to the Forum? Lastly, talk about breaking the buck barrier in your Group.

## #2 Where to submit Group Updates/Registrations

Our new “universal” on-line form is on the SCWS website:

[http://www.scws-al-anon.org/scwso\\_forms.php](http://www.scws-al-anon.org/scwso_forms.php)

Please have your GRs fill out the new form themselves, rather than doing it for them. Some of the AI-Anon Information Service Offices require that group updates be done by members from the group who have been elected by the group. They might not accept information submitted by DRs. So teach your GRs to go onto the SCWS site and fill out the on-line form there. You could “practice” at your next District meeting by having GRs use their phones to go onto the site and familiarize themselves with the form. They can then teach their group’s Secretary, Treasurer, and Information Service/Intergroup Rep (ISR) to use the form.

Our Spanish-speaking members who want to use the Spanish-language form and members who want to fill out the paper GR-1 will still be able to use those forms, which can be found on the SCWS website. Since they will be sending those hard copies to our SCWS post office box, the Group Records Coordinator may still have to direct them to their local AIS to complete registrations for some group changes. Submissions via our on-line form will be forwarded to the AIS offices by the GRC.

## #3 New group “Status” added

WSO created a new group Status category: *Group Reported Not Meeting*.

The way we find out that meetings have disbanded or have moved (if they did so without notifying us of their new address) is when a prospective member goes to the site listed with WSO only to find that there is no meeting. They then call WSO to report that the meeting is not there. In the past, WSO notified the Group Records Coordinator and requested that s/he follow up to determine the accurate Status of the meeting. In our Area, this notification from WSO is forwarded to the District Rep who might follow up personally, or might ask GRs to follow up to see what’s happening with the meeting. The meeting will remain in this Status for up to 90 days. If we don’t find out anything about it, the Status will be changed to “No Mail.”

Please remember that you don’t have to do everything yourself, as the DR. Ask your GRs to go to meeting sites, call the CMA, GR, or Contacts themselves, or ask other members if they know about the meeting. This is a “we” program! Once you get back definitive information about the meeting, let me know either with the on-line form or via a direct email. I will then update the Status of the group in the WSO data base.

## #4 Registering GRs in time to vote at Assembly

Because of the various processes that we need to go through in order to assure that we know who the registered GRs are in each District, the Task Force on Elections set the final registration date for registering GRs as **the first Saturday of May and November**. The Assembly voted to adopt that policy in November, 2013, and again in May, 2014. This 2-week time frame gives the Group Records Coordinator, the DRs and the Delegate

time to determine the accurate number of registered GRs who are delegated to cast votes at Assembly for their group.

Please educate your new GRs about this policy so that they don’t come to the Assembly thinking that they will be able to have a voice and vote if they are registering that day—or even if they registered in the previous week. They can certainly attend the Assembly and registered GRs can be their voice. But their meeting will not have a vote (from them) until the following Assembly.
