Officers' Reports

Delegate

They made it through some rough times and we will too. It works if we "keep coming back." It's a New Year and I want to do what I can to make our service commitments fun for you, and the coordinators and officers this last year of our 3-year term. Yes, previous experience reminds me that service can be fun.

The following are the WSO updates:

- The 2005 **World Service Conference (WSC)** theme is **"Energize Al-Anon – Expand – Explore – Experience!"** In Spanish, the theme is **"Vigorizar a Al-Anon - ¡expandir, explorar, experimentar!"** I would enjoy getting cards, love and prayers from you, our SCWS members here in Southern CA. You can also send love gifts for to me share at WSC, to: (mail will NOT be accepted before April 12)

- The WSO has sent me proposed revisions to the Service Manual that I am to vote on at WSC. One revision is to remove the words, "It is not a book of rules; there are no rules in Al-Anon." In my previous reports, I've shared that the WSO Board of Trustees is looking to clarify "Policy" with a capital P, verses policy. They feel that there are rules and they are moving at make that clear. I am concerned about this direction for our fellowship. Awareness, Acceptance, Action. I want to know what you think. If you share my concern, you could send me any reference to this that you find in our literature. Especially noting those expressions that come from our founding pioneers to help see if this is one of the "principles" of our fellowship. I also want to hear from you who are OK with the change.
- Resumes for Volunteers for WSO Advisory Committee positions are due by April 15 (prior to the WSC – sooner is better). The WSO forms can be downloaded from our SCWS website, scws-al-anon.org. The positions include: Alateen, Archives, Forum, International, Literature, Public Outreach, and Outreach to Professionals. (We submitted Mary Morrison as our REGIONAL trustee candidate. Resumes for Trustee-at-Large and the Committee Property Management are due Aug 16.)
- WSO staff (Ric and Raquel) and members from here in Southern CA went to Cuba in Nov. This is a direct result

of the Cuban contacts that were made by members from SCWS. Hooray for us reaching out to share our experience strength and hope, worldwide! The WSO has asked that we not raise funds but that individual members can send literature. Spain and Columbia agreed to help Cuba too.

- Lucia and members here have been working with the WSO and members in Puerto Rico to translate some Guidelines into Spanish. When completed, they will be posted on WSO's website.
- The WSO website has a new look with lots of information and they're hoping that more members will use the member's only page. You can find Inside Al-Anon XTRA, Conference Summaries, Area Highlights, Guidelines and much more at: **the Member's website [website deleted]**. Follow the instructions then go to Fellowship Communication, then to Newsletters.
- Our SCWS website has a new "forms" page with SCWS forms (and some WSO) to download.
- I want to share with you all that I have been asked to be one of the two spiritual speakers at the Conference this year. God is in charge (always) – we do the footwork and leave the results to him.
- The Jan. Board of Trustees meeting reported a loss for the year 2004, of \$160,000. Expenses were higher, in part due to staff and volunteer travel to Greece, Turkey, Cameroon, Togo, Ghana and Cuba. Contributions for 2004 were \$1,034,200. The reserve fund 2004 market value was \$5,114,000 (for 2003 it was \$4,941,000, note that our total assets are significantly higher, around \$10 million). The WSO budget for 2005 includes more expenses than income (expecting another loss, even though one individual contributed \$350,000 – limits were raised last year, see 2004 Conference Summary). The Trustees made advance payments on the property loan, lowering the balance now to about \$6,000,000 (this is separate from our budget). I have not yet received the 2004 audit. As Delegate, I read, review and ask questions on many issues, just one of which is our fellowship's finances.
- AA International is in July 2005, in Toronto Canada with Al-Anon participation (<http://www.aa.org>).
- Al-Anon is planning our own International Convention that will be held July 4-6, 2008 in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania with theme, "Let it Begin with Us."
- The WSO is planning a celebration in 2006 for our 55th Anniversary at the office after WSC, 4/29/06
- Our Regional Service Seminar (RSS) will be held in Honolulu, Hawaii, Sept. 16-18. Air travel to Hawaii can be least expensive in Sept., so it's a great time to travel there and to participate in learning and sharing about Service – and maybe having some fun on the beaches too. Information from the WSO is planned to be sent to the Current Mailing Address (CMA) for each group in March.
- If you need to update your group's contact information and CMA, please talk with your District Representative (DR), with the WSO, with Margie our Group Records person here today, and with your Intergroup. DRs can be a big support in all this. Please note that WSO now has a

new form for group registration (in English and in Spanish). In addition, Alateen groups now use a separate registration form. You can download the forms from the WSO members web page **website deleted**. They are also on our site: <http://scws-al-anon.org>, under "Forms."

- Alateen group registration forms and our SCWS Alateen safety requirement forms (both are in English and Spanish) are on our website, <http://scws-al-anon.org> – under "Forms" and/or Alateen.
- In late December, the WSO sent a memo to all Intergroups advising them that they can no longer list Alateen meetings that have not been approved. Kathi will provide more on this in her report.
- Delegates, past and present from all over our Region, will meet March 4-6 in Tucson, prior to WSC.
- A weekend of AI-Anon service meetings is planned in cooperation with AA, at PRAASA, March 11-13, 2005, in Tucson, Arizona. You can get more information at www.PRAASA2005.org
- There has been some brainstorming about the pros and cons of creating another Assembly Area in California. Currently, states can only divide once (we already have CA North and South) but together we've asked WSO Trustees to consider more. CA North discussed it at their meeting last weekend and we'll discuss it here today. If there is interest, and if it is allowed by WSO, it still would take lots of discussion and votes and even if we decided to move forward (I imagine) years before it might occur.
- A good place to get our Area's local information is at scws-al-anon.org our Southern California World Service (SCWS) website.
- Please keep me and all the World Service Conference members in your thoughts, April 16-20.

First, I am chair of the ad hoc committee on restructure. The Assembly has changed the way it functions — breaking into Action Committees in order to have the most input from the Group Representatives.

We've been prepared to have Action Committees at the Assemblies, but had the action of implementing the Alateen Safety Motion that took up so much time last year. Now on to the Action we planned and more in 2005!

The three Action Committee Chairs (Kay, Barbara, and Willie) met recently to see where we think we are heading. We felt we were moving in the right direction and that the Group Reps liked having their input lead the action at the Assembly. We came up with the following ideas for improvement as we go through this trial period:

- The GR's need to know in advance what type of Action is planned in their Committee. Thus we need to let the DR's know in advance of their District meeting.
- We need to have our coordinators more visible and involved in order for the GRs to know who they are.
- We want to focus on the importance of the GR as the link to participation.
- We need to get the report from our Action Committee to the other GRs in a more timely way. (Our minutes keepers will become more important.)
- We feel we need to be in better contact with our Area Chair.

Many of you are new District Reps or Intergroup or Convention Liaisons. Please see that the Action Committee Chair knows who you are and how to contact you before you leave today. This will be our fastest way to link to you with new information and projects.

Second, a By-Law Committee has been formed that will meet with the goal of having any Revisions or additions to our By-Laws to vote upon in November. As this is mainly incorporation of the votes made by the Assembly during this panel, it requires no action today.

Minutes of Area Assembly

Minutes Secretary– Minutes of Nov 20, 2004

SCWS Assembly

Chairperson Kary L opened the meeting with a moment of silence followed by the Serenity Prayer.

The Traditions were read by **Debbie, District 63**.

Chairperson Kary L recognized all guests, new DRs and GRs, and Past Delegates.

Minutes Secretary Shirley M moved to have the Assembly accept the May minutes as presented in the Bulletin. Motion

was seconded and carried by a majority show of hands. She then read the October Interim Assembly minutes (each person had his/her own copy).

A motion was made and seconded to have the minutes approved as read.

Rick S., District 12, called a point of order regarding the reconsideration of the motion to accept the SCWS Alateen Draft and Addendum held at the end of the October 9 Interim Assembly. **The Chairperson** said that she had checked and, according to Robert's Rules of Order, it is acceptable to reconsider a motion once. She also stated that, since she was not an expert on Robert's Rules, **she had asked David B. to serve as parliamentarian**" since he serves in this capacity in his work. She introduced David to the Assembly.

Questions regarding order of voting and recounts were answered.

Cynthia, District 24 asked for clarification of the term "overwhelming majority". The Chairperson defined it as a vote where only few hands opposed or abstained from voting on a particular motion. **Linda, District 45** questioned the use of Robert's Rules of Order. It was explained that sometimes they are used when important issues are being addressed and keeping order is important.

It was recommended that the Minutes Secretary add the word "written" where it says "the voting went to ballot" (went to written ballot).

The following corrections to the Minutes were also noted:

pp. 2) The paragraph "On the second ballot..." should read "The motion was defeated with 62 yes, 91 no, 3 abstentions and 1 void".

pp. 3) The paragraph "**Alateen Sponsor Coordinator Kathi L** reminded the group that..." needs to have "nor with the Area" deleted.

The minutes with the noted corrections were accepted by a majority vote of those present. There were 2 nos and 9 abstentions.

Treasurer Tom E reported two items of business: (1) the 2005 Budget, referring those present to pp. 17-19 in the August 2004 Bulletin, and (2) his recent move to Nevada, stating his willingness to serve out his term or to step down -- whatever the GRs decide.

Rick S., District 12 moved and **Mary M., District 39** seconded the motion to approve the budget.

Budget Discussion Highlights:

Kim, District 30 asked **about the lawyer who advised the Board** concerning the Alateen Guidelines and Addendum. **Tom** said that the lawyer, not a member of AI-Anon, provided the service "probono" because SCWS is a nonprofit entity.

In answer to further questions, **Tom** explained that the budget was not under New Business partly because the treasury surplus was discussed at the May 2004 Assembly; and, also, because the Board decided to have it presented early under Old Business to allow time later for World Service Guests to answer questions from the GRs. He reviewed page 19 in the

Bulletin and stated that he estimated the Megan's Law check at 300 x \$20 because everyone connected with Alateen would have to be certified this first time. The cost would go down in succeeding years. Also, there is still a surplus because there has been no contribution to the World Service Office in 2004. Therefore, if our income is lower than expected, there will be ample funds in the treasury.

Chuck, District 27, expressed discomfort with a deficit budget and asked a question about the prudent reserve. **Tom** explained that it is our policy to give any moneys over the prudent reserve to the World Service Office. Therefore, he felt that a motion might be needed to allow us to hold the surplus.

Miguel Z. spoke to the translator cost in the budget explaining that the \$75.00 is more than reasonable since professional translators make \$250 outside of the fellowship. **Tom** said that the Board had discussed this item and agreed that it was important to have a qualified person and that the Chairman can approve the expense.

In answer to questions about Liability Insurance, **Tom** explained that we currently incur premiums of \$1,300 for Liability and \$1,600 for Slip and Fall coverage. The insurance we are looking into to cover the Alateen Certification will cost \$1,347. It was explained that it is the best policy the Board could find at the present time. However, the Board has determined that it needs to clarify exactly who would be covered. The Board also wants to be sure that someone at the District level is covered. The Board recommends that, if the coverage is what we need, this policy be purchased in order to have something in place and that the Board continue to search other policies to ensure that we have the best coverage possible. (It was determined that Intergroups are a separate entity and probably would not be covered. The **Delegate** said that the Board will also check on this.)

Regarding a question about Delegate expenses going up. It was pointed out that the line item covers reimbursements for the whole year. The Delegate is invited to attend lots of meetings and there have been more Coordinator meetings to attend. The Delegate has been charging the costs incurred for these events on her card. She also paid for the Board Teleconference expense in July and charged the Board's meeting room costs on her card.

After a call for the vote, the Budget was approved by a majority show of hands.

Jack C., Mon. Night Valencia, called a point of order saying that it was standard practice to approve the Budget by roll call and vote.

In the absence of the Records Secretary, **Alternate Delegate Suzanne P** took roll.

Terry, District 63 moved to approve the Budget. **Debbie, District 63** seconded the motion. The motion passed with 142 yes, 29 no, and 6 abstentions.

Out-of-state Person Serving on SCWS Board Discussion Highlights:

Motion. **Debbie, District 63** moved that we allow Tom to complete his term, which ends December 2005. **Bernice, District 63** seconded the motion.

In answer to questions, **Tom** indicated what increased costs would be incurred if he remained in office and stated that he no longer attends meetings in Southern California because the nearest California meeting is 40 miles away from his home. He also stated that the by-laws do not address an out-of-state member serving on the SCWS Board.

Lisa expressed concern 1) about the increase in Treasurer's costs that would be incurred and 2) that allowing Tom to continue would set a precedent for the future.

Susan, District 17 expressed concern about someone serving our area who does not attend an area meeting.

After further discussion **Debbie** amended the motion to move that the area allow a one-time exception for the Treasurer to complete his term and that it does not set a precedent for the future. **Bernice, District 63** seconded the motion. The motion passed with 96 yes, 73 no, and 10 abstentions.

Delegate Miriam M reminded the GRs to be sure that addresses for meetings are correct. She reported that AA had mailed out AA International Convention information in September. Al-Anon and Alateen will be participating. Updates can be gotten online. Al-Anon will be holding its International Convention in Pittsburgh in 2008. Groups are asked to turn in subjects/concerns for discussion at the World Service Conference in April to Miriam by February 1. This can be done at the January SOS or by e-mail. **She introduced our WSO guests: Judy P., Chairman of the Board of Trustees, and Barbara O., WSO Alateen Coordinator.** ...The remainder of the Delegate's report is in the Bulletin.

Alternate Delegate Suzanne P started circulating the Forum Can and the Ask It Basket. She invited all new DRs and Intergroup Liaisons to attend the 9:00 a.m. Orientation Meeting to be held before the February 19 Committee Meeting. She gave a pep talk for the upcoming S.O.S. and asked everyone to "Energize" - bring a friend to the January S.O.S. There are discounts for people attending for the first time. The remainder of the Alternate Delegate's report is in the Bulletin.

Past Delegate Kay D announced that Action Committee Chairs were prepared and looking forward to the break-out sessions and that evaluation forms for the sessions are on the tables.

Alateen Sponsor Coordinator Kathi L reported that she has updated the Alateen Data Base and that registration forms will go out to the Districts, Intergroups, and Sponsors on Monday.

Literature Coordinator Helen C announced that Service Manuals are for sale for \$5.00 in the back of the room.

The 7th Tradition was observed.

Delegate Miriam M reintroduced the WSO guests. She stated that, **in response to requests from some of the GRs, she had asked that someone from WSO come to address the Area's concerns regarding the Board of Trustees' Alateen Motion.**

WSO Guests Discussion Highlights:

Judy began by saying she had been a member of the **Board of Trustees** since 2002 and that the Board discusses issues that the fellowship, through the World Service Conference, gives them. The Board functions as a knowledge-based entity (Concept 9) and discusses an issue until all come to a consensus. When the Board began discussing this issue, the consensus was probably 0%. Al-Anon's responsibility for Alateen and Alateen safety has been discussed at the Conference and/or by the Board for many years. An ad hoc committee on Abuse was established in 1968. The Board had discussed the minimum safety requirements for over two years before writing the motion. The Board felt that the action they took was what the **Delegates** wanted. **The Delegates** established guidelines in 1999 and they were printed in the Service Manual. The Delegates were concerned that people were not following them. The Board simply made the "guidelines", "requirements". She added that WSO's legal counsel was shocked that there was not something in place. It was upon the counsel's advice that the deadline became December 31, 2004. (The counsel actually wanted March 15, 2004, the Board had wanted December 2005.) The lawyer has had a relationship with Al-Anon, specializes in child protection, and represents other organizations that work with youth (e.g., Boy Scouts, Boys and Girls Clubs, etc.).

The motion did not have anything to do with Al-Anon's WSO owning property. The property is controlled by a separate Board. Owning property has saved Al-Anon many thousands of dollars. Unlike Alcoholics Anonymous, Al-Anon did not have protected rent in New York. The rent kept going up and up; owning property seems to have been the right decision for Al-Anon.

In answer to a question about the status of other areas, **Barbara** said that there are 67 Areas and that implementation of the motion is in varying stages due to Area autonomy. Six have complied. Each area has different needs. Two areas are voting in December and Ontario is re-voting today. She said that the WSO is prepared to handle large numbers of applications and is planning to track the effects on Alateen. For example, in Connecticut the Area went from 18 to 53 sponsors.

In response to questions about liability, **Judy** stated that Al-Anon has been liable all along and that the liability was greater because we were not protecting our name. Anyone could use it and did. The intent of the motion is safety and standards. The motion gives Al-Anon the ability to say who is Alateen.

Lunch was held from 1:00 - 1:30 p.m.

Motion. After further questions and discussion, **Tannis S District 60**, moved to reconsider October 9 Interim Assembly vote to accept the Alateen requirements.

Rick S., District 12 moved to table consideration to a later session, but this motion died for lack of a second.

Deena, District 40, and **Irene, District 21**, called a point of order. Motion to table can be reviewed at a later date. This would leave October 9 vote in place.

With Tannis's motion in abeyance, it was decided to vote on whether to reconsider the October 9 motion. After some voting

confusion, **Linda, District 54**, asked for clarification. The chair explained that a 'no' vote would allow the October 9th motion to stand, a 'yes' vote would mean the Assembly would reconsider the motion. A vote was taken resulting in 139 no, 39 yes, and 6 abstentions. The October 9 motion to accept the draft and addenda with corrections presented by Southern California stands.

Chairperson Kary L accepted nominations for **CA (S) Area's Regional Trustee**. David B., Mary M., and Kay D. were nominated. Kay D. declined the nomination because of a family member's health. **Hester B.** moved the nominations be closed, someone seconded the motion. After two written ballots were inconclusive (without a 2/3 majority), the decision went to the hat. Mary M is the nominee for CA (S) Area's Regional Trustee.

Assembly adjourned at 3:30 p.m.

Chairperson Kary L called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m. with the Serenity Prayer. She announced that this is the last year for the current panel of officers and encouraged those present to consider being of service on the SCWS Board.

Alateen members announced lunch plans for the day and a 50/50 drawing.

Twelve Traditions were read by **Jay P., District 36.**

Minutes Secretary Shirley M read the minutes from the August 2004 Committee Meeting. Minutes were approved by a show of hands.

Treasurer Tom E reported a balance of \$32,955.83 for the year ending December 31, 2004. The Area holds a \$25,000 reserve and he currently has about \$3,000 to deposit. There are many expenses coming up, but we are in good shape financially. The books for 2004 have been audited. He reminded the new attendees that the Area pays 30 cents/mile for traveled miles over 100 miles one way. In addition, the Area also pays up to \$50 for a hotel room to those who travel over 100 miles one-way. He reported that some contributions are still going to the previous Treasurer and asked that the DRs and Intergroup Liaisons remind everyone to use the new address: P. O. Box 350 North Hollywood, CA 91603.

Delegate Miriam M expressed a desire that we will discover "Service is Fun" this last year of the current panel. She asked us to please remember her with cards when she goes to the World Service Conference this year. The theme is "Energize Al-Anon - Expand - Explore - Experience."

Miriam also shared that the WSO has proposed revisions to the Service Manual that she is to vote on at the WSC. One revision is to remove the words, "It is not a book of rules; there are no rules in Al-Anon." She asked for input from the membership regarding this revision. During discussion later in the day, the DRs asked Miriam to clarify whether it was the Policy Committee or Literature Committee suggesting the revision. Miriam will get back to the DRs when she knows. **Miriam** shared an update on the possibility of creating another Assembly Area in California. Northern and Southern California have asked the WSO Trustees to consider this. She reported that there are 1,000 to 1,500 groups in our CA-S Area and that all of California has 10% of the total Al-Anon membership worldwide. Since Barbara W has lived in the southern-most part of the Northern California area and is now residing in the northern-most part of the Southern California area, Miriam had asked her to do some research. Barbara suggested that perhaps a central area could run from Monterey through Santa Barbara or Ventura County. This will be a work in progress and may take years to accomplish if it can be accomplished at all. In answer to DR questions later in the day, Miriam shared that in other parts of the country the average meetings/area is 235. Pennsylvania has 535. There are probably about 100 meetings in the central part of the state from Monterey through Santa Barbara. **Hester B.** added that each Area can divide once. The WSO's concern would be about votes. However, the fact that California was divided before the WSO began might allow a different view for the state. DRs suggested that maps of the proposed split would help them to discuss this with their districts. See Bulletin for full Delegate Report.

Chairperson Kary L thanked Alternate Delegate Suzanne Picott for leading the orientation meeting for new DRs, Intergroup Liaisons, and Convention Chairs.

Alternate Delegate Suzanne P started circulating the Forum Can and Ask It Basket. Suzanne reported on the January SOS and acknowledged District 64 who had 1/3 of the participation at the SOS.

The next SOS will be held January 21, 2006. See Bulletin for full Alternate Delegate report.

In her absence, **the Past Delegate, Kay D's**, report was given by Lone Member and Membership Communication Committee Chair **Barbara W.** DRs were reminded to look in the Bulletin for what is planned for their Action Committee at the May Assembly meeting. New DRs, Intergroup Liaisons, and Convention Chairs were asked to be sure to let an Action Committee Chair know how to reach you. See Bulletin for full report. There was no Lone Member information to report.

Records Secretary Margie L had a packet containing meeting information for each DR to review and to report any changes to her on the SCWS form located in the Bulletin. She passed out new directories (rosters) and took roll. Forty-one voting members were present.

Alateen Marina chastised Al-Anon members for not attending Alateen events, encouraging everyone to get involved, support them, and help with SCAC.

Alateen Jonathan announced the dates for **SCAC: July 16-17 at the University of Redlands.**

Alateen Coordinator Andy B also encouraged support for SCAC and Al-Anon attendance at Alateen events. The next event is a **March 19 "March Madness"**.

Public Information Coordinator Lil S had a packet for each DR and Liaison. Report is in Bulletin.

Ronald Slutsky delivered The Audit Report of, and Letter of Recommendations for, Southern California World Service of AFG, Inc. Report is in Bulletin.

Alateen Sponsor Coordinator Kathi L distributed and reviewed the three forms necessary for Al-Anon Members Involved in Alateen Service Certification and Meeting Registration. The forms must be filled out as directed and the District must sign off on them before mailing them to her.

Old Business:

Delegate Miriam M reported that the Area did not purchase additional liability coverage to cover abuse allegations/molestation. A legal reviewer said the policy that the Board was looking at would not do what was desired and was not worth the money. The WSO insurer has a policy to cover officers and directors but excludes molestation. She has found Abuse Allegation insurance for \$2,400 which requires acceptable policies and background checks. The company would not say what is acceptable and has asked that we send our policy to them. In answer to a question, Miriam does not know if the WSO or other areas have coverage. Finding insurance is an ongoing process.

Chairperson Kary L announced that the **Seventh Tradition** was \$81.50.

Lunch Break - Noon - 1 p.m.

Chairperson Kary L went home at lunchtime due to illness.

Alternate Delegate Suzanne P reconvened the meeting at 1:00 p.m. Suzanne explained that District and Intergroup Liaison reports for the Minutes Secretary and Bulletin Editor are expected at the Committee meetings and Assemblies but are only read at Committee meetings. There is a box for copies in front of the Minutes Secretary. She makes copies and forwards copies of these to the Bulletin Editor. Reports can also be e-mailed to both the Minutes Secretary and Bulletin Editor.

Concepts were read by Rosalba R., District 64.

Institutions Coordinator Mary Lou V announced and encouraged attendance at the 24th Annual Southern California Hospital and Institutional Conference of Alcoholics Anonymous with Al-Anon participation to be held April 29, 30, and May 1 at the Double Tree in Orange. Sara and Jeb R. will be the Saturday Al-Anon luncheon speakers and Patrick S. and Denise L. the afternoon panel speakers. "The Family Afterward" meeting will be held Sunday morning.

Mary from District 60 won the Alateen 50/50 drawing and Judith from District 12 won the Forum subscription.

New Business:

1. Budget allocation of funds for SCWS Board members to attend PRAASA.

Delegate Miriam M suggested that instead of Board members alternating attendance at PRAASA, that members be sent to other Areas' Regional Service Seminars. She stated that the PRAASA's AA and Al-Anon Areas do not coincide. She also said that Al-Anon receipts had been lost and that Al-Anon had no money for its program. Miriam also said that Al-Anon selecting the Al-Anon chairman was not happening.

Discussion Highlights re SCWS support of PRAASA:

Pro: Board members would be meeting with Al-Anon members in other regions of the country who hold the same Al-Anon positions.

Con: **Hester** explained that the money loss was some years ago and was probably due to Al-Anon not AA. An Al-Anon who worked on the Al-Anon program said AA has been paying the Al-Anon expenses and that there had been no problem with this. Concern was expressed that Al-Anon received their service roots in AA and that PRAASA is the only place that Southern California AA and Al-Anon members can interface to share about areas of service. Also, it might be more costly to send Board members to RSS around the country than attend PRAASA, which is in the Pacific region.

Suzanne called for show of hands on whether to place the question about PRAASA on the agenda. The Committee voted to place it on the May Assembly Agenda.

2. Budget allocation of funds for Delegate to attend an International Convention.

In the past SCWS has sent the Delegate to Al-Anon and AA International Conventions. Miriam has registered for the AA convention but needs to know if she is to go and needs to purchase an airline ticket. The committee approved the expense. The Board can authorize up to \$2,000 in expenses without Assembly approval. It was decided to handle the ticket this way and to place the item on the agenda so that future Boards can handle these items as a matter of policy.

3. Subdivision of District 12 to include: Santa Barbara, the cities from Carpinteria to the south, through Goleta to the north-west (to become District 8 and will elect its own DR). District 12 would still include Agoura, Newbury Park, Thousand Oaks, Westlake Village, and Simi Valley. District 12, along with the Santa Barbara Intergroup, has submitted its consent to the creation of this new district. The Committee is in agreement that this request should be submitted to May Assembly.

4. Update on (potential) additional Area(s) in CA. See earlier discussions.

The Committee members felt that today's presentations were not well prepared (too many questions had to be asked) and requested that the Board clarify presentations so that issues are understandable and that there is sufficient information for them to take back to the GRs.

Coordinator Reports:

Hospitality Coordinator Martha M reported that the following districts are to furnish brunch refreshments for the May Assembly: 17, 21, 27, 33, 36, 42, 48, 57, 66, 78. She asked that each district bring a volunteer to help with serving and clean-up. Any district which is unable to furnish refreshments is asked to call her. Report in Bulletin.

Alateen Sponsor Coordinator Kathi L reported that thirteen meetings had all forms in and 60 Al-Anon members have returned the Al-Anon Involved in Alateen Service forms. Each person will be given a WSO ID number, which needs to be placed on the Alateen Group Registration/Group Records Change Form. The WSO is returning forms once a month. She has received five back from WSO. She will return the forms to District Representatives. Intergroups and District Representatives will need to work out how they will work together on directory listings, requirement enforcement, and responsibility for Alateen.

Kathi announced that Alateen events and a contact telephone number are listed on the Web Site and also stressed the need for Al-Anon members to attend Alateen events. She believes that the Alateen requirements came about because Al-Anon members were not involved and knowledgeable about Alateen. It is to our best good to know who is sponsoring our kids.

Kathi announced an Alateen Workshop to be held April 16 from 10 to 3 at the Fullerton Center. Jerry W. from Ventura County will be leading the workshop. Kathi and Willie W. will assist him.

Alateen Coordinator Andy B. See above.

Archives Coordinator Marge V announced that the Archive Board is available if someone needs to take it. The Longtimers Meeting will be held October 29 from 10 to 3 at the Fullerton Senior Center. A volunteer list was sent around. See Bulletin for full report.

Bulletin Editor Elizabeth K introduced herself. She requested that all reports be sent to her within a week. Reports can be e-mailed.

Cooperating w/Professional Community Coordinator Lee T reported that the new outreach is to the medical profession. He is planning to cooperate with AA in this outreach.

Literature Coordinator Helen C has received no information from the WSO.

Action Committee Chairpersons Willie W and Barbara W announced that everyone look for their hot topics for May Assembly in Bulletin. Barbara said GRs need to be encouraged to stay for the whole Assembly. It is a meeting like any other meeting and begins at 10 and ends at 4. GRs do not want to miss information for their meetings.

The **Ask It Basket questions** were read and answered by various Committee members. (Alternate Delegate Suzanne P shared the Ask It Basket Questions.) See Bulletin for Answers. She also announced that meetings need to be registered to receive a free Forum.

They need their safe place at meetings as do we and often times they also need rides. In an effort to see that they are as "safe" as possible our Central Office is waiting for the information on which local Alateen meetings now have "certified/registered" sponsors and people to help with transportation to meetings and/or Alateen events. I have observed that our SCWS is doing the footwork to get these folks registered, now we just need to know the results. This final loop has not quite been completed, but we will keep asking questions until we receive the info!

Archives: The present Chairperson continues to carry the torch for our Archives. While we don't have the yards and yards of material that SCWS has accumulated, we do have some really cool stuff! We now have 2 or 3 portable displays that can be loaned out for local Al-anon events. 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have 2 folks on our Service Board in charge of putting it together and with a little coaching at the beginning of the year from our Office Staff, they do a great job!

Web-site: I really must marvel at the inroads the internet has made over that last few years and L.A. Central Office has done a really good job taking advantage of this medium. Our local meetings can even send in their update sheets over the net now!

Phone calls: Our L.A. Central Office continues to field a great many calls every month, many from folks inquiring about Al-Anon for the first time. Our staff, the Dynamic Duo, does a great job steering these newcomers to meetings but they would be overwhelmed without some help every day from our local Volunteers! We have several folks who are able to come in with some frequency to help out but there is always room for more! Ask-It Basket Questions

Q. If all Alateen sponsor requirement forms have not been processed yet, can we still list the meetings in current meeting directories and web sites?

A. World Service has asked Intergroups not to publish Alateen meetings that are not registered. Each Intergroup and district that publishes a directory needs to determine what that looks like and what their requirements are for publishing Alateen meetings.

Q. Is the insurance issue that Miriam talked about today going to be an agenda item at the May assembly? If so... in what form? If not... why not and when?

A. A report from Miriam will be on the "Old Business" part of the agenda.

Q. What is the policy on a person making up a song pertaining to Al-Anon, then making a CD and selling it?

A. This question may be better answered by the WSO. Please reference the Service manual on the following pages:

p.76 Selling products can divert us from our spiritual aim, no outside products are to be sold at meetings.

p.71 The singer should be anonymous, at levels of press, radio and TV if mentioning Al-Anon.

p. 85 Copyright - If there is a copyright violation created by using the Al-Anon name, the Trustees would notify the violator.

Q. How does the WSO plan to help Cuba?

A. The WSO plans to work directly with Cuba but has not (as of Feb 2005) decided the best way to do that.

Q. Are the area members of Al-Anon who went along with the two members of World Service still involved in going (to Cuba) and raising funds? Or is World Service taking over direct contact with Cuba?

A. The WSO executive director has asked that we do not have group fundraisers but that individuals can send literature directly to Cuba (if individuals have personal contact established in Cuba).

Q. One of the Alateen sponsors took the area requirements and promised to sign and mail them to me, the District Representative, in December. I still don't have it. I've called several times and stopped by the meeting. He keeps promising to mail it, but doesn't. The other sponsor for that meeting is registered. What do I do?

A. Each district needs to determine their own enforcement policies — Alateen meetings will not be registered at WSO unless a new Group Registration form and WSO Al-Anon Member Involved in Alateen Service form and SCWS form. I suggest you discuss this at your District meeting and have the District decide how it should be handled.

Q. Do other Intergroups send complimentary copies of their newsletters to Group Representatives?

A. Registered Intergroup Reps receive a complimentary group copy of the Intergroup newsletter. Registered Group Reps in Southern California receive a complimentary group copy of the SCWS Bulletin. Anyone who is both an Intergroup Rep and a Group Rep would receive a group copy of the Intergroup newsletter and a group copy of the SCWS Bulletin.

Sharing of Service (S.O.S.)

Energize Al-Anon;

Expand, Explore, Experience

Expand Our World Wide Vision Winnie S., Southwest

Regional Trustee: The theme mirrors the Board of Trustees' vision and mission statement; "All people affected by someone else's drinking will find help and recovery in every community," and "Anticipate the future and Al-Anon's place in it, and insure that the necessary resources are available." Our Executive Director and Board Members have traveled all over the world, helping people to set up local structures. Everyone has the same problems as we do here in the U.S. We are not unique. We are not an anonymous fellowship, our membership in the fellowship is. We do not need to be anonymous when we do public outreach.

Has our Al-Anon program changed from the way it was originally meant to be? No, we still have the Steps, Traditions and Concepts. The people have changed. Perhaps we don't have the patience to work through things.

Unity with Alcoholics Anonymous. AA has traveled the world and invited us along to spread our program. At one time the Big Book was approved by Al-Anon. Many years ago it was taken off the approved list. Her sponsor told her to read the Big Book at home, there is much to be learned from it, but didn't belong in the meeting. Dilution of the program: Bill W. said, "keep us drunks out," in reference to keeping Alcoholics out of the structure (not out of the program.) "Dilution of our program happens when we continue tweaking our program to fit others' needs." We are here for the same reason.

We are making changes in our Service Manual to make it more user friendly. Anything taken out will be moved to the back of the book.

Regarding the Alateen changes made this year, if you look at previous Conference Summaries, you'll see this topic has come up repeatedly. The Board of Trustees works under a "knowledge-based culture." Instead of having a motion thrown on the floor and having to discuss it, the Trustees talk/research/consult/pray first, and then ask, what do we need this to be before a motion is made. Work with your head, not your heart, ask what is the principal of the issue, not the personality. After doing all this, the Board used their legal authority to protect the Al-Anon fellowship and most of all to protect our young people. In Winnie's area, New Mexico, they were glad to finally have some requirements in place.

Pat H., Palm Desert: Thankful that her sponsor had her do service from the start. When she sent in her resume to be a Trustee, the World Service Office used her on an advisory committee that matched her talents, she was put on the committee to purchase property. Every few years Al-Anon had to look for a new place for our offices because of rent raises, etc. and the staff was always involved in it. AA's main office is protected from rent raises, etc., through (Pat thinks) a

Rockefeller. When Al-Anon decided to purchase and build, we are now all in one building; office staff, print shop, etc. In 1993, Al-Anon had a projected loss of \$139,000. Since moving into our own structure, we have not had a net loss, and saved as much as \$500,000 a year.

Pat was the Chairman of the Executive Committee for Real Property Management in 1994, Concept 9 explains our leaders need to be visionaries, yet compromise. The Board was committed to buy property only if the conference approved. It always comes down to the delegates. Pat strongly recommends whenever you have an opposing viewpoint, you must state your views, but do not send a delegate to the conference and tell them what to do. Inform your delegate how you feel, then trust your delegate to make an informed decision because information may be given to them there. Each year since the relocation we have a profit, which helps us to reach out to more people and do a better job of getting our message across to the world.

Kay read: Pg. 175 Service Manual: "As individuals and as a fellowship, we shall surely suffer if we cast the job of planning for tomorrow onto a fatuous idea of providence. God has endowed human beings with considerable capability for foresight, and evidently expects us to use it. Therefore, we must distinguish between wishful fantasy and thoughtful estimate. This can spell the difference between future progress and unforeseen woe.

Q: Can you explain more AA offering Al-Anon a place to stay in their building?

A: Pat – I've never heard that.

Q: Was the decision to create safety guidelines for Alateens, in any way related to our property ownership? There was talk that we were fearful of being sued and our property would be in jeopardy.

A: Winnie: These are two totally separate issues. One does not have anything to do with the other. We have insurance which would take care of any problems. Also, we have had lawsuits against the WSO regarding Alateen. We did not bring these into publicly controversy, they were dealt with.

Explore Unity Through Service

Kathy G., Dist. 33 – There's been a push in her District to go to meetings and involve more people in the District. Her District puts on an Alathon every year, and this year, they put on a 4th Step workshop. We're all here to get better, and that is unity. All the service positions were filled by District Reps. She was surprised that she didn't know her fellow panelists today, but through sharing and unity found we are all somewhat alike and share recovery.

Paul F., Dist. 27 – Service is an important part of his recovery. I get out of it what I put into it. Used to think unity was conformity, but that's not true. Anonymity helps bring unity because it is our spiritual foundation. The amount of recovery he experiences is in direct proportion to the amount of service he gives.

Hubert, District 27 – Unity is another word for connection – among people, and that is a party of our recovery. Our First Tradition focuses us on our connection with each other. Stay

with the program, stay committed to service, continue to build connections and you'll be fine.

Experience The Joys Of Service

Carolyn D., Dist. 17 – To be a part of the meeting she volunteered to get people's approval and to be known. She discovered that doing service helped her to learn more about herself. Doing service has not always been joyful, but it has always been a learning experience. She's learned not to say "no" to service unless she was overwhelmed and unable to do it. When she didn't do things right, no one beat her up for it.

Marina M., Dist. 56 – Her first service was on the SCAC Committee. When there were events, she was timid and didn't want to take charge, afraid people would get angry with her. She's learned she can't always get her way, which is hard to realize. But when she does her Steps and talks to God everyday, she gets the feeling it's all going to work out okay. And things don't always go the way you want them to. It's awesome to travel around Southern California and have so many people know her, and ask about SCAC stuff.

Amanda C., Dist. 39 – Recovery: To get back what I lost, my morals, values. Service through the Concepts, carrying the message, is our third legacy. She uses the Service Manual like a text book. "Service is a vital purpose of Al-Anon." It means that service is really important, to live all three parts of the triangle, to become whole.

Expand Ways To Keep The Al-Anon Focus

Portia S., Dist. 24 – When a newcomer gets to an Al-Anon meeting, it's important it is an Al-Anon meeting, and not therapy. When we share outside issues, it's dividing. God's in the Service Manual, if you read, you're ahead. "The spiritual foundation of Al-Anon is found in the General Warranties of the Conference." The General Warranties say that no Conference member shall be placed in unqualified authority. All decisions should be reached by discussion, vote, and unanimity, and that no Conference action be punitive. We should never perform any act of government. These are beautiful spiritual tenets to live by.

Cynthia P., Dist. 24 – Are my meetings being diluted by outside influences? Yes, by members of other 12-Step programs. The focus tends to shift. People think it's all one big program and we should share it all. This makes me feel unsafe. The only requirement for membership is a problem with someone's drinking. How can I help the program to grow and still remain Al-Anon? "Al-Anon Spoken Here," is an awesome pamphlet and should be read more. Also, "The Three Obstacles To Success In Al-Anon." At another meeting, we chose to read the following from the Service Manual: "In the spirit of unity, it is suggested that only Al-Anon and Alateen Conference Approved Literature, be used and displayed at meetings." It is a non-punitive way of addressing that. If I have the knowledge, it's my responsibility to share that knowledge.

Susan V., Dist. 17 – I don't have to have the answers, but I can learn where to find them. I started a FAQ file. Any time a question came up and the answer was given, I'd do research and put it in my file. I wrote to World Service about crosstalk and got a letter about past Forum articles and past Conference Summaries. I have files today on crosstalk, dual membership, outside literature. The answer to our problems is sponsorship

and the Service Manual. My thinking was distorted by alcoholism.

Explore Your Recovery Through Service

Cathy S., Dist. 54 – Something as simple as leading a meeting is doing service. She does service at work, at home, as well as in Al-Anon. Her mother-in-law was of service to her, when her husband was drinking. Now she can be of service to her mother-in-law. It doesn't matter how long you've been in Al-Anon, she remembers where she came from, and she's no different or better than anyone else. Being involved in service expands her program. When you do service, it's a commitment. In Al-Anon we learn to keep those commitments. Service has given her a lot of recovery, and a better relationship with her kids and husband.

Marge V., Dist. 72 – Her early service was leading a meeting, doing coffee, etc. Then she took commitments outside of the group. She always did lots of service work for her family and in the community. She was afraid if she volunteered in program, lots of work would be dumped on her. Instead, people were there to help her out. She's grateful for the Service Manual, and Al-Anon sponsorship book, which says she doesn't have to have all the answers. She's willing to ask other people. She learned in meetings that other people had good ideas. In service I learned about my character defects; being in charge, being right, arguing until other people agreed with me. I've learned to say, "you might be right." Today I can disagree with my family and it can be okay. We don't have rules, but following guidelines means we learn to bend a little. I learn something every time I come to our assembly, and I learn from each person I meet.

John K., Dist. 54 – He's been lucky to be involved in service outside the groups. It was pointed out to him, 10% of the people do 90% of the work. Over time he's seen that, seen the same people. This isn't good or bad, but he's grateful to be one of the 10%. It is important for him to be involved. The service he's presented seems more of a hassle at first, but in hindsight he's grateful. The thing that he is asked to do, is always more important than what he's going through in his life. That focus has helped him immensely. He's learned his strengths and limits. There were times when he wasn't completely prepared for the job he was asked to do, but he would ask people and learn. If my personal feelings get too involved, I get off course. I'm generally on safe ground if I focus on the job that needs to be done.

Experience The Ride

Lydia, C., Dist. 21 – Started in Alateen. Meetings were few and drivers needed. Her first service was with other Alateens, at World Service or Intergroup. She learned her voice was necessary and appreciated. As a young person in Al-Anon she went all over to meetings with young person's focus. Getting to meetings, driving with people, helped her to share personally and get to know others. She went to meetings, conferences, conventions, stayed in a hotel with her sponsor who had a "get in the car" attitude. It enabled her to build her self-esteem. Gave her self-confidence. She's had a hard time getting newcomers to get in her own car. Once you experience S.O.S. and participate, it gives you a boost to your own program.

Leah R., Dist. 12 – I learned how to show up, and that's valuable in my program. I didn't know I was an isolator until I

got here. Whenever I was asked to volunteer or participate, fear came up. I got dragged to an Assembly in my first six months. It was desperation that got me into the car. Let's look around for the most desperate newcomer and invite them to get into the car. She loved that people were laughing at her first S.O.S.. It wasn't what she expected at all. Today she got to drive to S.O.S. with a dear friend, they talked, and listened to a speaker tape. Getting in the car, going to a meeting, sharing the program, is how I learned my job is not to get ahead, but to serve, and to be as humble about it as I possible can be.

Chris L., Dist. 45 – Got into service immediately, at her 2nd meeting. Knew she needed a hook to bring her back to meetings. Her home group emphasizes service and sponsorship. Information she had heard in the group, she was now responsible for bringing back, and she heard it differently. She didn't realize that she was an isolator. At her first District Alathon, she was around World Service people, and volunteered to be a Group Rep at her meeting. At her first District meeting the District Rep was leaving and no one wanted to take the position. She volunteered. It forced her to learn a lot. She ended up learning a lot about herself. Doing with others gives her a different experience. She's made a conscious effort to take someone with her to events that are important to her.

Subject: **Year 2004 Annual Audit**

We have reviewed the books and records of the Southern California World Service of AFG, Inc. for the years ended December 31, 2004, 2003, 2002, 2001 and 2000. Our review was limited to the Balance Sheet accounts, which included bank reconciliation's of the Cash and Cash Equivalent Accounts and analyses of the remaining Balance Sheet accounts. We believe the Balance Sheet accounts are fairly stated as of December 31, 2004, 2003, 2002, 2001 and 2000.

Due to the nature of the collections of the revenues, we were unable to perform any testing of those Revenues as recorded in the books of account. We did limited testing of the disbursements (expenses) made through the checking account. Consequently, we cannot offer an opinion on the Statement of Revenues and Expenses, nor the Financial Statements as a whole.

We prepared a Statement of Cash Flow for the Year Ended December 31, 2004, 2003, 2002, 2001 and 2000. Due to the limited scope of our review, we cannot express an opinion in regard to the Comparative Statement of Cash Flow.

There were no irregularities discovered throughout our review. Several recommendations are presented in a separate letter to the Treasurer and the Executive Committee.

Subject: Statement Presentation, Accounting Procedures, and Audit Procedures

1. Our experience has shown us that "**Advances**" paid to vendors, or committee members, for expenses, could create an unnecessary financial burden to "The Statement of Revenues and Expenses". Therefore, our recommendation is to reduce, or eliminate, the concept of paying for goods, or services, until such time as the goods have been received, or the services have been performed.
2. Paid bills (invoices) should be segregated and filed by year. Individual files should be maintained for each officer and coordinator.
3. The Audit Committee is to receive a P & L Summary by December 20th, comprised of the current year's activity through November 30th.
4. The members of the Al-Anon Family Groups Fellowship, who receive payment in the form of checks for reimbursement/expenditures, should be notified of the following:
 - A. It is our suggestion that receipts be given to the Treasurer prior to issuing disbursement checks, including copies of telephone bills. Mileage forms should show actual date incurred.
 - B. A more successful Financial Audit would be as a result of timely depositing of all checks disbursed.
5. Outstanding checks issued, and dated, prior to January 1, 2004 should be written off.
6. Newly printed checks should include the following statement thereon:

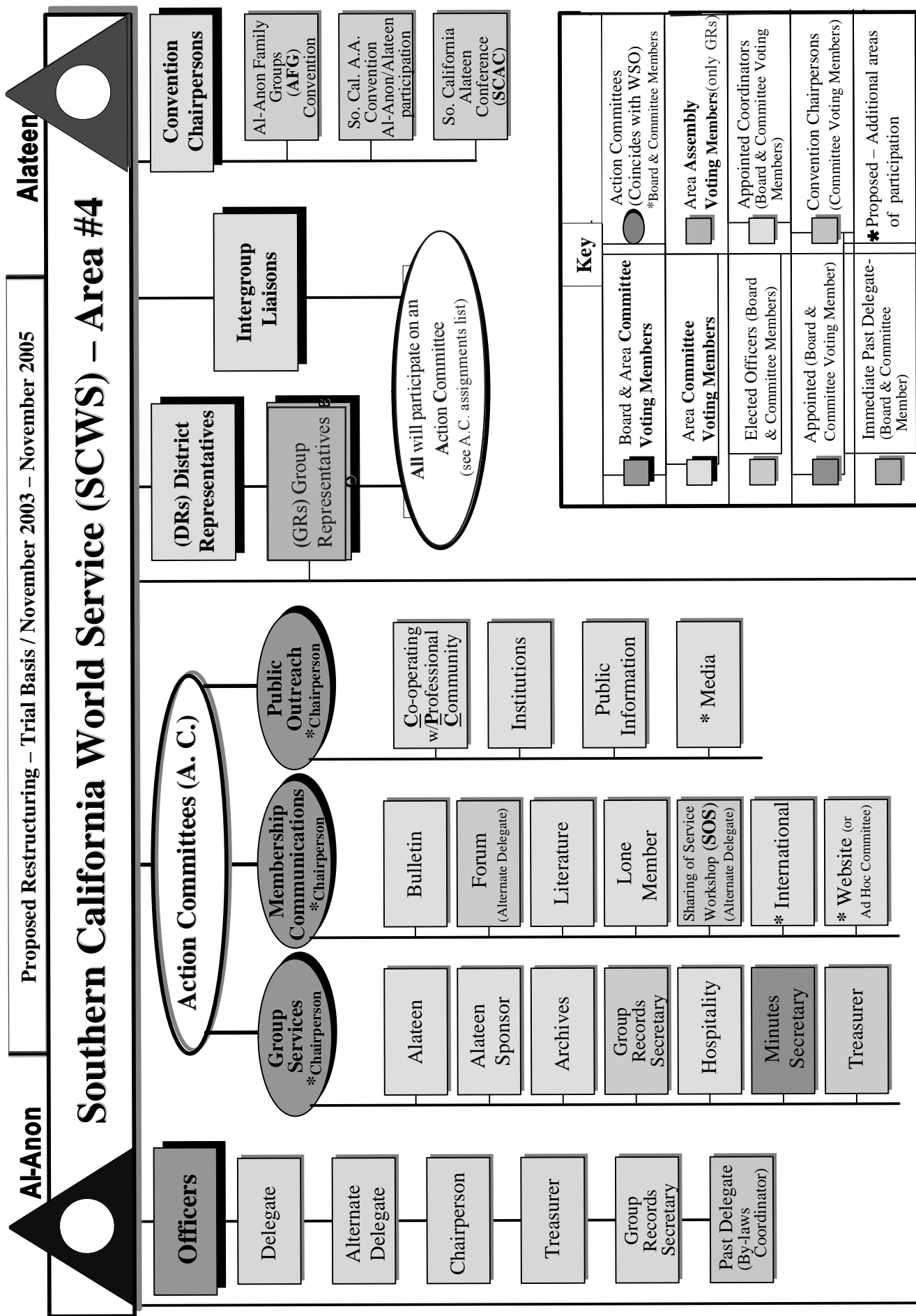
