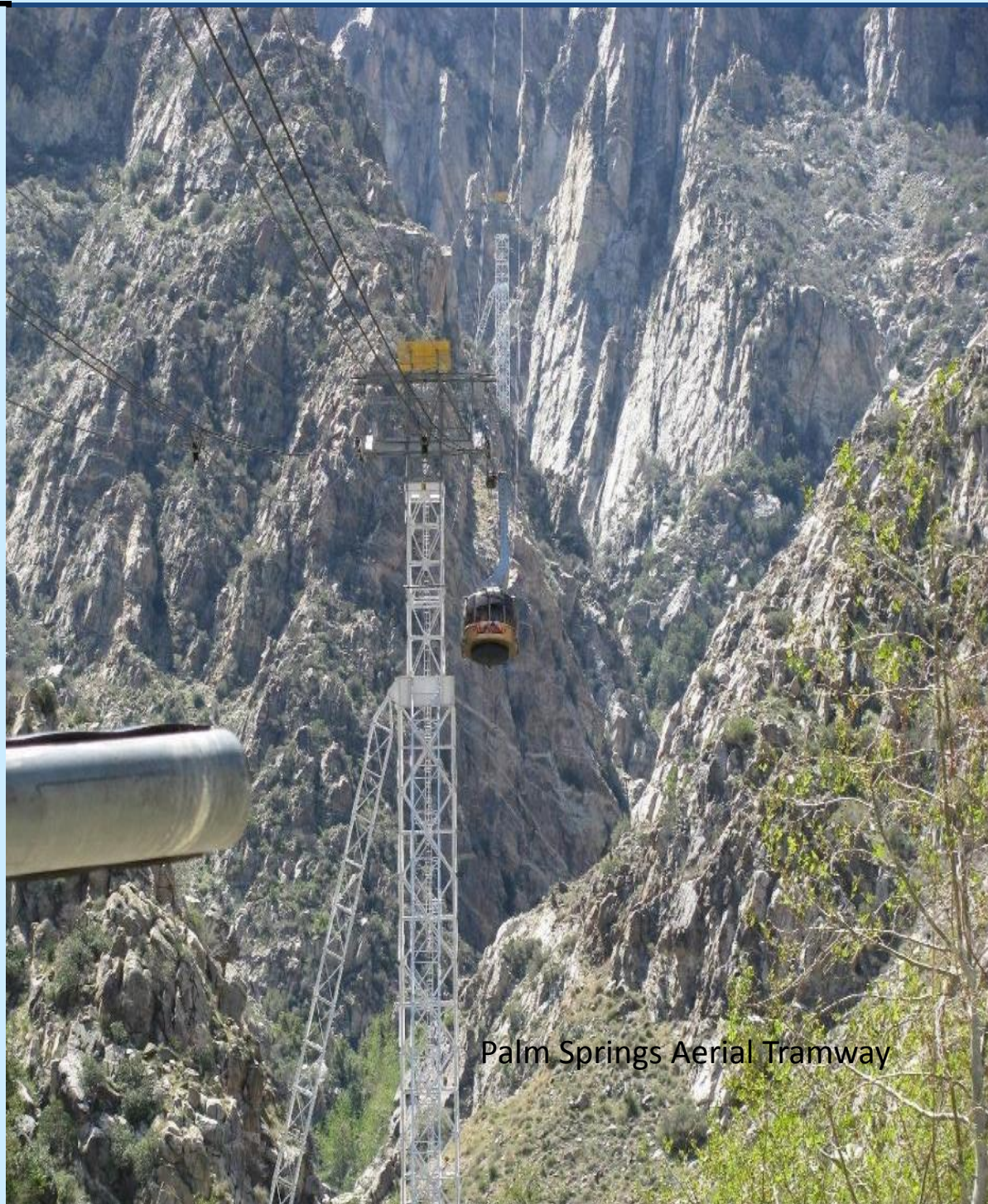

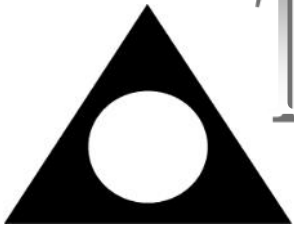

**Chairman's Report** – Recognition of past delegates (Jayme, Panel 52; Kay D., Panel 40; Willie W., Panel 37; Sandie E, Panel 49.)

**Roll call Donna E., Records Secretary**

**Jayme Immediate Past Delegate** - Reviewed 12 Rules of Conference; update on Task Forces.

**Sandy P. - Secretary** – Minutes approved with corrections. Motion to approve Minutes with corrections made by Richard, D27 and seconded by Matt, D17.

**Eva B. – Treasurer** – Presented year to date financials, however passed on reviewing the financial report as flyers needed to be distributed first. She went forward with SCAC report and budget proposal. Motion to approve budget and Financial Statements made by Paula, D27 and seconded by Mindy, D17. Vote to approve financials passed with two abstentions.

**Donna E. Records Secretary** – Reported 1,231 active groups; 80 no mail meetings; 317 inactive meetings. Discussed titles Group Rep, Intergroup Rep. Information Service Representatives. Reminded everyone to use WSO I.D. number only. Thanked Website Coordinator Irene for updating the form online and thank you Ben P., former website coordinator for initially putting the form online. Donna went through the form line by line and clarified. Number 15 is the new section with comment a section up to 150 characters.

**7<sup>th</sup> Tradition baskets being passed.**

**Pete B., Interim Alternate Delegate.** Report read for Pete by Jayme C. in Pete's Absence.

**Jayme C. – Electronic Voting Report** – Reviewed history of electronic voting, new proposal, information, due diligence and KBDM on electronic voting. Electronic voting to be voted on in the afternoon. Bylaw changes will be discussed at a later time. Jayme shared that at the WSC when deciding on a motion, they ask three questions: Is it accurate? Does it have clarity? Can you live with it? Open for discussion. Following comments and questions were made:

**Q. Mindy, D44: Why aren't we actually testing the new equipment?**

**A.** The electronic clickers were used at the November 2014 Assembly. At the AWSC Meeting (Area World Ser-

vice Committee Meeting) the District Reps voted to not rent the clickers for the May Assembly.

**Q. Veronica: Why did we decide to buy?**

**A.** Attendance at Assemblies has increased to the point that tables have been removed to allow for more seating which means more votes to count, and adoption of KBDM process with the use of Thought Force and Task Force models means more issues on which to vote at each Assembly.

**Q. Vicki, GR: Asked about guarantees and warranties.**

**A.** There is a two year warranty on the proposed clickers. In addition, the clickers are very hard to break. Students from K-12 to college use them daily. They are dropped all the time and yet very hard to break. Think of your television remote.

**Q. Michela, GR: Exact cost?**

**A.** \$10,275. With shipping and tax \$11,000.

**Q. David, GR: Why are we switching vendors?**

**A.** Continued research was being done and we were able to locate the vendor that the WSO uses. These devices have a more basic capability and will more meet the needs of our membership. They are easy to use and will provide all the capabilities we will need plus a network connection is not necessary to use the system. Clickers are less complex and the base station can handle up to 500 devices. The system can support multiple base stations should higher capacity be needed in the future.

**Q. Where will the clickers be stored?**

**A.** SCWS Officers will determine among themselves who will maintain and store the clickers. The clickers will be stored in an environment that is conducive to their durability. Trust our trusted servants to be responsible to manage and store this valuable asset.

**Q. Esther: Cost of batteries?**

**A.** The batteries last a long time (again, think about how long the batteries of small calculators last). These batteries will last for 25,000 responses or the minimum shelf life which is usually about 7 years for this kind of battery. New batteries cost approximately 80 cents each.

**Q. David: Why not continue with paper ballots? He attends another function and they still use paper ballots and it works just fine.**

**A.** Hand ballots have no privacy or anonymity. Paper ballots take time, a lot of time, to count. Elections with paper ballots take an entire assembly from 9:00AM – 4:00PM. The November 2014 election Assembly using clickers took one hour!

**Q. Sara, GR: You will love the clickers!**

**Q. Any estimated new costs after purchasing the clickers?**

**A.** No. Only if we need more than the 350 purchased, and it is \$30.00 for each new additional clicker.

**Q. Suzanne P.:** Clickers will be great tool but we don't vote that much. Suggests renting and using excess money for public outreach and billboards.

**Q. Beth, GR:** This is 2016 and time to use updated equipment.

**Q. Andy, GR:** Likes to take back issues to his group for voting and they like that too, so maybe more voting with new clickers.

**Q. Irene, GR:** Clickers can be used for more than votes. They can be used to take a consensus. Our Assembly is only one day and clickers will help us be more efficient by freeing up more time to discuss important issues. We are growing and there are far more people at Assemblies.

**Q. Patricia, GR:** Why are we discussing since it seems to be already decided?

**A.** Yes, the Group Reps have voted on multiple occasions to vote electronically. We have done extensive research on renting or buying and we are presenting all of the information to the Assembly.

**Q. Willie W., Past Delegate:** Glad to see this coming as he has to count the votes by hand as a Past Delegate. I will be out of a job!

#### **Delegate Report May 2016 Assembly Meeting**

The 56<sup>th</sup> year of the continuing conversation at the World Service Conference (WSC) between the 67 Delegates in the U.S., Canada, Puerto Rico and Bermuda, the Trustees, the Executive Committee, and the World Service Office Staff was held in a hotel in Virginia Beach, VA, for 5 days in April 2016. The Conference theme was “Realizing our Spiritual Potential.” The following day we celebrated Al-Anon’s 65<sup>th</sup> Anniversary, 1951 – 2016, with a banquet and two speakers, one who is a very long-time member and another who is a former staff member of the World Service Office (WSO) in both New York City and Virginia Beach.

We have grown from the 56 groups who received the 1951 questionnaire from the Clearing House Committee (formed by Lois W. and Anne B.) and selected the name Al-Anon in the first group conscience decision between groups, to the more than 25,000 groups in 133 countries and 107 electronic meetings today. We have approximately 1,250 groups in

California South, CA(S) in 2016.

At the 2016 WSC, we continued discussing and voted on updates to the descriptive text of Concept Eleven and to the Policy on Memorial Contributions. We began a discussion on an update to “Announcing Events at Meetings.” We discussed the current model of Alateen and heard the results of the recent survey of Alateen members. We heard presentations by the four Task Forces that began their work at the 2015 WSC, each composed of Delegates, Trustees and World Service Office Staff. We began a conversation about a recommendation from the Literature Committee, composed of Delegates, Trustees, World Service Office Staff and Al-Anon members at large. We discussed the Annual Report of the World Service Office (WSO), the audit of the 2015 WSO budget, and the current 2016 budget. We viewed the current Public Service Announcements (PSAs). Delegates attended an open Board of Trustees meeting, an open Policy Committee meeting where they discussed the terms “open and closed meetings,” and the Annual Board of Trustees meeting.

The Executive Director retired in April and Mary G. was appointed as the Interim Executive for a period of time to ensure the new office structure is functioning well. Plans for restructuring the World Service Office began a few years back and now are being implemented. The Director of Business Services, a non-member position, also retired.

A new position of Director of Programs is being developed. This position will be responsible for participating in the development, implementation, and evaluation of all WSO activities that serve members, and those activities that seek to attract new members who can benefit from affiliation with Al-Anon. Along with education and supervisory experience requirements, applicants are required to have a minimum of ten years active Al-Anon membership and Al-Anon Area leadership experience. The complete job description has been posted on AFG Connects under Announcements – WSO Structure.

We prepared for the week of Al-Anon business by reading files that were sent to us ahead of time, each with a deadline for Delegates to submit comments and questions, which were answered by Trustees and World Service Office Staff. The collection of all questions and responses were provided to us in our Conference Notebook on the day before the Conference began. Even with all this prep work, we still asked new questions at the microphone on every topic. This is why there is a strict 2-minute, one-time-at-the-mic limit.

Today we will talk about the 2015 and 2016 WSO budgets, we will see a skit and presentation from the Task Force on Acceptance of Communities, Cultures and Beliefs, and we will hear some of the Knowledge-Based Decision Making done by the WSO Literature Committee that led to their unanimous recommendation to the Conference.

Districts have invited the Delegate to present additional Conference topics throughout the summer and fall in their neck of the woods. The Conference Summary will be available on the members website in June and in print in July/August.

## Concept Eleven

Revisions to the descriptive text of Concept Eleven reflect changes to the structure of Board committees approved by the 2002 WSC. The amended text describes various structure changes of Standing Committees, as well as the addition of Thought and Task Forces and Work Groups, while keeping in mind that Al-Anon is a worldwide fellowship and that not all International structures have made the same changes.

## Memorial Contributions

After several years of discussion at the WSC, this year we approved a motion at the 2016 Conference to amend the text for Memorial Contributions on page 95 of the Policy section of the Service Manual. The motion specified a definition of “family” by use of the donor, and a limit of \$500 on a one-time basis per donor in memory of deceased Al-Anon members, by family members who are not Al-Anon members. This amount represents 0.01% of the WSO’s General Fund. This motion reflects the spiritual principles of Tradition Five and reinstates a similar policy that had been in place from Al-Anon’s early days until 1986. As we heard from the Executive Director at the 2015 WSC, most of these contributions, historically, have been approximately \$25-100.

Any Al-Anon or Alateen member may make contributions to the WSO in memory of anyone who is deceased. (Contact the WSO for details).

## Announcing events at meetings

There are Al-Anon members who hold events in the name of Al-Anon for their own personal gain. These events are not part of any service structure (AIS, District, Area). The money raised at these events is not accountable to anyone. A member from CA(S) asked the Policy Committee to review the wording of this section of the Service Manual to provide more clarity to the groups as they seek to eliminate announcements of such events from their meetings. The proposed text included spiritual principles and criteria regarding conventions and other events. It was presented in a motion to the 2016 WSC as an effort to help prevent Al-Anon’s name from being linked to outside enterprises, clarifying Tradition Six. The discussion will continue at the 2017 WSC.

## 2016 WSO Budget

At the 2015 WSC, the WSO budget showed that Projected Income – Projected Expenses = -\$52,000, partly due to declining literature sales. The Conference voted to leave this projected budget deficit of \$52,000 for the year rather than just taking the difference out of the reserves – because the Delegates wanted a chance to inform their Areas, anticipating that members would contribute more to make up this projected shortfall. The budget also included increased projected contributions of \$1.7 million compared to the \$1.5 million that members and groups contributed in 2014. This additional total of \$252,000 divided into the number of groups contributing in 2014 came to a request for an additional \$25 in 2015 **per contributing group above what they contributed in 2014.**

Groups indeed contributed more, but not the \$252,000 needed for the budget. On top of that, literature sales took a nose dive. There was a projected \$10,000 decline in literature sales for 2015, but it turned out to be \$237,000 less. Hence, in the May 2016 WSO quarterly appeal letter that just came out, **individual members are asked to contribute \$15 per year if they can**, recognizing that some of us are in a place right now where alcoholism has taken a toll on our financial lives and so we are asked to contribute what we can, as individuals.

So, the May 2016 quarterly appeal letter asked for \$15 per member in 2016 and beyond, whereas the 2015 budget indicated a need for \$25 more per group in 2015.

Note that when we are informed of the budget situation and we are asked to contribute more to the WSO, this also includes *continuing our current levels of contributions to the other 3 service arms: SCWS, the District, and the AIS, Area Information Service (a.k.a. Intergroup office).*

**We are fully self-supporting (Tradition 7).** This means that we do not get government money or corporation money, or any money from any outside source, and **therefore the WSO has only two sources of self-support: literature purchases**

**and contributions.** For many years this has been 2/3 from literature purchases and 1/3 from contributions. Since literature purchases have declined severely, this decrease in income must be made up by increased contributions if we are to be able to provide the same level of services at the WSO. Last year the free group subscriptions to *The Forum* ended, in a cost-savings measure that would have the least impact on WSO Services provided. Hopefully the fellowship indeed will be able to contribute more to the WSO so that we won't have to start eliminating more essential services.

#### **Recent contributions**

2013: 1,405,814 actual

2014: 1,521,388 actual

2015: 1,649,337 actual, 1,700,000 budgeted

2016: 1,800,000 budgeted

Let's keep up the momentum and continue sending more to support the services our groups require. Members and groups contributed more in 2015, but not as much as was in the budget.

#### **Recent literature sales**

2013: 3,143,505

2014: 3,060,050 (83,455 less than prev)

2015: 2,822,801 (237,249 less than prev), [budgeted 3,050,000 which is 10,000 less than 2014]

2016: 2,600,000 budgeted (222,801 less than prev, being realistic of the trend)

Note that through 2014, 2/3 of the revenue to cover the expenses comes from literature sales. We believe this trend in decreasing lit sales will continue and that we will need to rely more and more on contributions. Remember, the only two sources of revenue for the WSO are member contributions and literature sales – per Tradition 7, we are fully self-supporting.

#### **Revenue minus expenses**

2014: -16,195

2015: -361,024 actual, -52,000 budgeted

2016: -184,000 budgeted

This is 2% of \$5 million

Unbalanced budget.

The WSO is looking for ways to cut back on expenses with as minimal cut backs on services as possible.

In the year 2000, there was a net income of \$149,000. In today's money, the \$4,089,000 in support that year (literature sales + contributions) is worth \$6,000,000 today, yet in 2015 the WSO received only \$4,754,000 of support (literature sales + contributions).

If I only knew, I would adjust.

What spiritual principles in financial matters can you think of? Gratitude. Participation is the key to harmony. Trust in the Higher Power, PLUS do my footwork. 7<sup>th</sup> Tradition, fully self-supporting; one side of the coin: I give what I can; other side of the coin: tell me how it is because I cannot adjust if I

don't know how it is.

As part of the Finance Committee's duty to keep a watchful eye on expenditures, we must find places to cut expenditures while not affecting core services to the members. The suspension of the complimentary copy of *The Forum* to the groups is one such action taken in 2016, which costs \$100,000. (Note that this is approx how much groups in CA(S) contributed in 2015.)

#### **Workshop:**

#### **WSO Task Force on Acceptance of Communities, Cultures and Beliefs**

This workshop includes ideas for group members to welcome and give comfort to newcomers from all communities, cultures, and beliefs, while keeping the focus on Al-Anon's primary purpose of helping friends and families of alcoholics. Cultural differences and diversities may include:

-Differences between people due to age, religion, race, gender, social or economic status, physical or mental status, etc.

-Differences among groups of people and individuals based on ethnicity, language, sexual orientation and/or geographic area.

Just as was done at the Conference, members of the Assembly read the presentation and performed the skit, and were asked to consider in breakout discussion groups what we could do to overcome our own discomfort and reach out to people who are not "like us." How can we avoid separating into cliques and familiar groupings, or being territorial at our meetings? How can we actively demonstrate at our meetings and in public outreach that we are a recovery support group available to everyone everywhere?

#### **Workshop:**

#### **WSO Literature Committee Recommendation**

See both the Brief Highlights from the 2016 Conference and also the 2016 Conference Summary on the members website: Service Structure / Area Resources / Conference Summary

One of the roles of the Literature Committee is to review suggestions that come from the fellowship for new literature or changes to existing pieces. If it involves a major decision, the topic is brought to the World Service conference for discussion. During the last year, the Committee began discussing concerns from Al-Anon members regarding the "Prayer for Today." This prayer is included in the Just for Today Wallet Card (M-1-) and Bookmark (M-12), as well as in How Al-Anon Works for Families & Friends of Alcoholics (B-22, B-32).

The Literature Committee introduces the topic to the Delegates at the Conference in a one-hour discussion in order to seek a wider perspective and receive more input. Some Delegates reported that there were members in their Areas who believed this was an attempt to "remove God from our program." While many Conference members were opposed to the idea of removing or making changes to any piece that had such a long tradition within the fellowship, others expressed con-

cerns that the prayer muddled the border between spirituality and religion. What seemed particularly troublesome to some was the line, “it is in dying that we are born to eternal life.” They felt this is a specific religious belief, the discussion of which is cautioned against in the “Three Obstacles to Success in Al-Anon.”

The Conference agreed to continue the discussion next year, after the Delegates conduct informed, Traditions-based discussions within their Areas, in which all aspects and points of view can be examined prior to reaching conclusions. In following this process, we trust that all group conscience decisions will be, as stated in Tradition Two, the expression of the loving God of our understanding.

In the workshop at the Assembly, members read the background provided by the Literature Committee, and then each of the five questions of Knowledge-Based Decision Making (KBDM) was read along with two of the responses from the Literature Committee members.

Districts, individually and in groups, have invited the Delegate to present Conference topics, including these two presentations – the TF on Communities, Cultures and Beliefs, and the Literature Committee’s KBDM presentation.

#### **6<sup>th</sup> Al-Anon International Convention**

Al-Anon’s Sixth International Convention will take place July 5-8 in Baltimore, Maryland.

International Conventions are a great way to celebrate recovery, meet old friends, and make new ones. An International Convention is where members from Canada, the United States, and many other countries gather together to speak the same language – the language of the heart.

The registration fee for the Convention will be announced at the 2017 WSC. Conference members were told that registration forms will be available in August/September 2017.

Now is the best time to plan your budget to attend! Here are a few important things to consider:

1. Estimate your travel expense.
2. Think about how many others you may want to room with you.
3. Plan on registering early for the lowest registration price.
4. Total these items for a preliminary budget.
5. Divide this number of weeks remaining to determine how much to save each week.

Remember to talk to members in your home group and even those you sponsor about attending and making their budgets too!

## **Immediate Past Delegate**

Greetings Southern California Al-Anon and Alateen. I am very grateful to serve each and every one of you as your Immediate Past Delegate. I have the joy of serving in a position on the Southern California World Service (SCWS) Board and know that my time is limited. We call that “rotation of leadership” in Al-Anon.

At the February Area World Service Committee Meeting (AWSC) the District Reps requested that a status report be given at the Assembly of the on-going Task Forces in the Area. I am prepared to do that today for you. Currently, there are four Task Forces, one Work Group and we do not have any on-going Thought Forces.

The Task Force on Bylaw Changes has not started yet. It is composed of all the past Delegates in CA(S) that are currently active. The charge is to assure that the SCWS Bylaws are current. The updated SCWS Bylaws will be brought forward at a later Assembly for a vote of the Group Reps.

The Task Force on Live Scan has completed its charge. It was a recommendation from the Area Alateen Safety and Behavioral Guidelines Task Force. Prior to August 2012 SCWS was using Megan’s Law for background checks. Megan’s Law only provided information if an applicant was a registered sex offender

and no other felony convictions. Currently, we are using a background company called Trak-1. If a potential AMIAS provides their social security number an in-depth report is given to SCWS from Trak-1. If the social security number is not given, a report is provided with minimal information received from the applicant's name, birthday and address. This is not sufficient.

SCWS has been approved by the Department of Justice (DOJ) for the use of Live Scan Background Checks. Currently, the AAPP is researching the different options with this process. The rolling fee varies based on the facility providing the service. Discussion will be needed with the Districts and Group Reps regarding costs. It now costs SCWS \$25 - \$35 for each potential new AMIAS to receive a background check. It could be substantially higher using Live Scan.

The Task Force on Changing the Age of Alateens, Overnighers and Special Needs was started because of the recommendation of the Area Alateen Safety & Behavioral Requirements Task Force. This Task Force is ready to begin.

The District 64 Task Force is an active working Task Force and they are working very hard toward a recommendation to the Assembly. This Task Force was born from the District 64 Thought Force. Their charge is to evaluate the 3 possibilities brought forth by the Thought Force. Those three possibilities are: (1) leave District 64 as is; (2) have several overlay Spanish districts; (3) have all the Spanish speaking Groups in District 64 align to their respective geographic districts.

The Task Force on Groups Who Do Not Consider Al-Anon as a Whole is on-going. The charge was to create a Policy for Groups who do not follow the Traditions or consider Al-Anon as a whole. This is an active Task Force. They have consulted with other Areas that are already using a Policy and have also consulted with the WSO.

The SCAC Work Group is a vital link between SCWS and SCAC. The face-to-face meetings are held quarterly and are an opportunity for members of SCWS (Area Treasurer, Area Alateen Sponsor Coordinator, AAPP, Delegate, Immediate Past Delegate and AMIAS at Large) and SCAC Committee (SCAC Chair, SCAC Co-Chair, SCAC Treasurer and SCAC Sponsors) to collaborate and collectively come up with resolutions to problems. Because the SCAC Committee and SCAC Chair and SCAC Sponsors change annually, it is a useful link to not lose the progress the Area has made in the past few years with SCAC.

SCWS has never had this working type of relationship with SCAC before and I cannot stress enough what a vital link it is for the Area and SCAC!

### Electronic Voting

In 2011, the Group Reps said: "We need a more efficient process for voting at the SCWS Area Assemblies"! Voting happens at all Assemblies and Committee Meetings, in addition to election Assemblies. In November 2014 electronic clickers were

used for the election. We found that they were easy to use, saved time, were accurate, provided immediate results and allowed for more Area business to be conducted on that day. The wishes of the Group Reps are clear. Yes, we do want electronic voting. The discussion will be held; we will take questions first and then we will have time for comments.

Today's discussion will focus on the purchase of using the 10 button electronic clickers for every Assembly and Committee Meeting. Previously, we discussed the 5 button or the 10 button. We have removed the 5 button clicker because it would not be useful when we vote at an election assembly with more than 5 candidates to choose from for one officer position.

We will discuss purchase only and not rental. The rental price over five years is about \$22,000 versus \$10,725 cost to purchase plus tax and shipping. Only 15% of the Group Reps voted to rent clickers at the November Assembly. We vote at every Assembly and Committee meeting and at times are votes are personal and we want privacy. We have done our due diligence and research. We are making the recommendation today to purchase the clickers.

The reason we have changed vendors from Turning Technologies to Audience Response Systems is because the WSO has used this company. These are the same clickers used at the WS Conference. The previous vendor is now charging the purchase price plus a software licensing fee for each member using the clicker and each time we use the clickers. For example, for 60 months of use it would cost SCWS \$11,174. Versus the \$10,725. total price. With that price SCWS would own the software outright.

The motion was brought forward in the afternoon and the motion read: SCWS to purchase 350 electronic voting devices at a cost not to exceed the purchase price of \$10,725. Plus shipping and California Sales Tax. Motion passed!

**Q. Does SCWS have an insurance policy for groups? A GR was looking into it and was told Northern California has insurance.**

A. Yes, California North has insurance. However, California South does not. Some AISs in the area are looking into it.

**Q. Can we, please, place on the agenda and announce during the meeting who has voice/vote? Also when making a motion, members need to identify their service position. Our assembly has customarily had donations to WSO in our budget. should it come from our reserves?**

A. This information is printed in our bulletin.

**Q. Why did SCWS state "If each group donated \$25 more a year we'd be solvent"? At last assembly – AND then the envelope came for personal "individual donations" of \$15.00 each. Why both?**

A. That was not for SCWS, but WSO. This WSO conference explanation that "if each member donated \$15.00 we could eliminate the deficit." This was an example of what a member could do, not a directive to contribute.

## Group Records

### #1 Group Statistics

**Active Groups -- current number: 1,231** (down 3 from 1,234, November, 2015)

These groups have a Current Mailing Address (CMA) and/or a Group Representative (GR).

**No Mail -- 80** (up 14 from 66 in November)

If there is neither a CMA nor a GR for a group, they go into *No Mail* status.

**Inactive -- 317** (up 25 from 292 in November)

After 2 years, of *No Mail*, a group becomes *Inactive*. They stay *Inactive* for 3 years, if there are no financial contributions made to or from the group. If there is a financial contribution made, the group may be *Inactive* for up to 7 years. After those lengths of time, a group is *Marked for Deletion*.

**Marked for Deletion -- 66** (down 7 from 73 in November)

These meetings will soon be deleted from the WSO database. Their identification numbers are retired and cannot be re-used.



## **New Meetings since last Assembly: 25**

### **#2 Do you know what the *Information Service Rep* is? Pgs. 63-65 of the *Service Manual*.**

According to our *Service Manual*, “Group Representative” is the title for the service position of the person who represents the voice and the vote of the meeting at District meetings and Assemblies.

The “Information Service Representative” (ISR) is the title of the person who attends meetings of the Al-Anon Information Service (AIS) or “Intergroup.” In the past, it has been the custom for almost all of the AISs in Southern California to refer to the ISR as the “Intergroup Rep” while some of the AIS’ call the GR the “World Service Rep” (which is not a title in our *Service Manual*).

Because this creates confusion for our members (i.e., “Group” and “Intergroup” are so similar, while “Group Rep” and “Information Service Rep” are distinct and different), it might be helpful to work with the AISs to ask them to consider changing this nomenclature, over time. This may require a change in the By-Laws of some of the AIS/Intergroups. It will be a long-term project, but will hopefully result in more clarity of these service positions for our members.

It is also suggested in our *Service Manual* that in order to facilitate cooperation between the Area and the local AIS offices, the Alternate GR may serve as the ISR/IR, and the GR serve as the Alternate ISR/IR.

**#3 Do you know your group’s WSO ID#?** Please memorize it and make sure that your meeting’s Secretary and Treasurer have it and use it on any correspondence and/or contributions to any of the service arms.

### **#4 The New Universal Group Update Form**

**Thanks to our incredible, dedicated, skilled and hard-working webmaster, Irene, our new Universal Group Update Form will be up on our SCWS website in a week or so!**

We’re hoping that the form will satisfy the needs of all of the local Information Service offices, plus our needs at SCWS (and WSO) for updating our group’s records.
