## Officers' Reports

Delegate: Mary Morrison

May 2008

What a wonderful experience it has been to have served the Southern California Area as the Delegate for the past three World Service Conferences. This last Conference was no exception, what an awesome time I had, the most memorable moment was when we all got to tour "Stepping Stones" the home of Lois and Bill Wilson. I was sure that I would enjoy it but did not realize what an emotional experience it was not only for me but for many of us. Being in their home and reading some of their letters to each other tugged at my heart. I even got to play a few notes on Lois' piano and to sit at the very table where Ebby talked to Bill about staying sober. It so reminded me of my growing up during the 40s and 50s. Please be sure and check out the pictures in my album in the back of the room, not only from this 2008 Conference but the other two as well. Also, in the large plastic box in the back are many "Love Gifts" from the members of the Conference be sure and help yourself to one or two of them, some are really quite unique. I have a booklet of pictures from my panel #46 that Sandi Cox of CA (N) put together, if you would like to see it, I have it here. Thanks again to those districts I have visited this year. There are only a few districts that I have not been too. Give me a call and schedule time for me to visit with your district and participate with your members, this is my favorite part of being Delegate, getting to meet with all of you.

The WSC gave conceptual approval to the Literature Committee to develop a piece of literature on Al-Anon's first 60 years. Also, the WSO has developed a pod cast that you can access by going to the AFG website (English only at this time) and can be downloaded to a MP3 file for beginning meetings. It is really well done and is a typical discussion relating to an introductory meeting, try it out. This is the first of a series of six pod casts entitled "First Steps to Al-Anon Recovery." These pod casts will have a new one every two weeks. Our new book "Discovering Choices" will be available at the International in Pittsburgh, PA. The price is \$15.00. I should have a copy to bring back for you to see at that time. In the meanwhile I do have a copy of the cover. It is in the same format as the "Opening" our Hearts, Transforming our Losses" book. The focus of the new book is on relationships and I am

looking forward to reading it.

Incidentally I do have forms for the Conference Reunion Luncheon at the International; this is a separate luncheon from the Pioneer Luncheon. The cost is \$45.00 and is open to all past and present

Conference members and one guest. If you are interested please see me for a form. It will be held on Friday, July 4<sup>th</sup> from 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 pm. I am really looking forward to the International and hope to see many of you attending this wonderful event.

We will be nominating someone today for the SW Regional Trustee position for the next two years; the Trustee for this year is Karen Rimmell from Arizona. Hopefully we will have not only a nominee from our Area, but a backup person as well.

I have had the privilege this past year to work on the first Task Force Committee (a new concept) for the WSO. We (one chairperson, two Delegates, two Trustees and two WSO people) developed a new guideline and it is quite exciting to see it in print (G-41). It took the seven of us eight drafts to accomplish this new piece and we are quite proud of it. It is a really good comprehensive guide to determining how to distribute funds at all levels. Much better than our previous pie chart piece that was out sev-

eral years ago.

We especially wanted to be sure and not dictate how much donation to each entity as can be evidenced by checking out the back page of the brochure, it has blanks to be filled in by the group when they vote on how to distribute their funds. You can download this guideline G-41 as well as all other guidelines at the AFG website. The WSO is considering using more Task Forces and Thought Committees to accomplish many of our goals, one of which would be utilizing our Past Delegates on a Task Force as they have an accumulation of so much knowledge and understanding of our fellowship. We even talked about the committee I am on becoming a task force and rather than having only a few meetings a year, to use the internet and teleconferencing to communicate our ideas on Admissions and Handbook. I believe this will give more members a chance to become involved in the decision making process for the entire fellowship. This has been evidenced also by Amanda Cole, our previous PI Coordinator who is now on the Public Outreach Committee for the WSO, what a great way to express ourselves and get the ideas and interests of all of us in the Al-Anon family. One of the other Thought-Force ideas resulted in the pod casts that I mentioned and the formation of the Web Marketing program.

In addition to the Task Force I was on, the Conference Committee asked that I chair a workshop at the Conference with Roger C, a new Trustee. We gave a workshop on the Concepts which was very informative and included about 40 participating members. We assigned questions and handed out the Concepts pamphlet (P-57) for the discussion. This new idea of including more Delegates in the Conference program was extremely well received.

At the open Policy Committee meeting we had a lengthy discussion regarding email. Some of the ideas were: Email addresses by officer and coordinator positions rather than by their name. (i.e. scwspochair.org). Have a written guideline for email. Establish a workforce or task force to check

all Guidelines on Anonymity especially at this level. Be sure to use email etiquette. Not a good idea to use your work address, since your employer can access that account it could break the anonymity of those that you send and receive emails from.

The Conference had a considerable discussion regarding the petition that I submitted regarding the expansion and/or consolidation of an Area rather than division by state, province or territory. The entire Conference was receptive to this and I could have placed a motion but felt that more discussion. would bring clarity to this proposal, it will be on the agenda for next year's Conference for discussion. My goal for the next three years is to work on the logistics and forming of this proposal in order that it will be considered and changed to fit the needs of all of the fellowship, not just the two California Areas. We need to look at our Area and decide what would be feasible if we do split (geography, diversity, impact on finances, number of meetings, attendance at Area meetings, etc.). We also discussed the impact this would have on outreach and how technology could be used to accomplish this goal. I really believe that there should be no more than 600-700 meetings in an Area and this would give us and other Areas better representation and participation.

There were 93 voting members at the Conference this year. The motions that were submitted this year all passed including the motion for the Bequest to be any amount rather than 10% of the total revenue of the previous year (pg 85). The Conference will be given approval on how to spend the excess funds over the 10% figure and will decide how and when this overage will be spent. The proposal is to use 25% of the overage each year for four years until depleted and this will be discussed and decided at the 2009 Conference. I did go to the mike several times with questions on this motion and felt that they were answered fairly. The vote on this motion was 70 for, 23 against. One of the other motions was a policy motion on the text on Pg. 83-84 regarding anonymity; this was for better clarification of the wording. Several of the motions were made for clarity in the text of the Service Manual.

Once again we had a workshop on KBDM and how this process of discussing issues leads to an informed group conscience and builds bridges throughout the fellowship. One of these topics was how to reach families of A.A. members. Communication between spouses works well. Go to A.A. meetings (open) and share Al-Anon after meeting with those perspective members. Build a relationship before and after meetings. Dual members – tell A.A. members what Al-Anon is, what it isn't.

The Charter changes were discussed in regards to protecting the Alateen Traditions as we passed them last year. The Charter will reflect that they too are protected from word changes.

Our SCWS groups donated in excess of \$66,000 to AFG this past year. I do have a list of the contributions which I will give to our Treasurer. Contributions to WSO were slightly above last year (\$297,000). Also income from The Forum is up

about \$1,000. The property should be paid by 2010; we still owe approximately \$220,000. In 1961 55% of our groups contributed to WSO, almost the same today. WSO cost to groups is \$3,503,000 for services provided, this is a per group cost of \$228.33.

One of the memorable events at this year's Conference for me was when one of the delegates asked my name while we were having lunch at Stepping Stones, when I told her my name she said "oh, yes, you are the one always at the mike!" Another delegate said to associate a word with my name so she used mike to remind her of Mary and every time she saw me throughout the week she would say mike, Mary. I really did enjoy participating this year at the Conference and once again it seems that at the end of our term we really start to understand what it is and what we can do. I had a great time in Panel 46's skit; we divided into 5 groups and dressed like 5 of the topics we had discussed over the 3 years term. Of course, I was in the part on pyramid sponsorship and three of us dressed up like Egyptians and came out dancing to "Walk Like an Egyptian." What fun. I especially enjoyed all the three minute talks from the members of my panel (46). These talks will be in the Conference Summary in the fall.

We had three visitors with voice but no vote this year. Inge from Germany. She stated that their GSO started in 1967; they had their first Alateen meeting in 1973. Today there are 880 groups, 41 Alateen groups and 65 adult children groups. Nydia from Mexico said that there Conference was formed with 73 groups in 1973. Today they have 3300 groups, 420 Alateen groups and their office has 17 staff members and 36 delegates. Louise from So. Africa also attended and she said that this was the first time that they had the money to send someone. Their GSO was started in 1963 and their first Conference was in 1964. In 1996 they structured their conference using our model. In 2006 they received a substantial bequest that gave them the opportunity to have a full time administrator and become a tax-exempt organization. In 2007 they decided to own property. The history presented by these three members was very interesting and rewarding and to hear there struggles to get to where they are today.

Many good ideas have come out of the past three Conferences, one of the best was the website called "The File-Exchange" there are several categories within this such as Conference, Public Information, Archives, etc. This site provides those of us with a position in our Area to up-to-the-minute information and guidelines plus access to any new literature, etc. Over the past three years the WSO and AFG Trustees have opened up and been more helpful and receptive to our questions and ideas than at anytime in the past. I truly have enjoyed working with all of them and perhaps will get an opportunity to do so again, maybe on a task force or other committee for past delegates.

There was a question as to whether there will be future RSS's. The discussion was that perhaps we

could have one day seminars at an Area meeting and have WSO members bring the seminar to our Areas and thus be able to reach out to more members

The Chosen Agenda Items this year were: "How the Al-Anon Alateen message can reach families of active A.A. members and attract those family members to our meetings" and "What bridges can we build between all members of the WSC and between the WSC members and the fellowship?" Also, "Attracting (and keeping) other cultures to Al-Anon." The discussions on each topic were carried out by a WSO member and a Delegate and these discussions were very informative perhaps we could use these topics for discussion at a future S.O.S. I have some examples of "Hot Topic" sheets which we could use for our workshops.

Norma from Utah gave us a new thought, "The Three B's: Be brief, Be brilliant, Be Gone!" Next year's (2009) World Service Conference will be in Virginia Beach.

Whether we agree with one another we must strive to preserve our Traditions and find ways to bring Al-Anon to those we have yet to meet. Current membership is the link to keeping our fellowship alive.

The Action Committee Ad Hoc Committee presented 3 suggestions to the November 2007 Assembly regarding possible changes to the composition of the Southern California World Service (SCWS)
Board. The Ad Hoc Committee and the SCWS Board have considered all options and now recommend that the SCWS Board remain basically as it is. <a href="Intere-fore">Intere-fore</a>, no motion is proposed and no vote is needed. If you would like additional background information on how we reached this decision, it was presented and is printed in the Past Delegate Report for the Feb. 2008 Committee meeting. Members of the Committee are: 2 GRs, Marilu and Melisa, 3 Board members, Martha, Shirley and Suzanne, and your 3 Action Committee Chairs, Cindy, Robin and Willie.

What we do want to make clear to you is **how YOU can serve** as a member of the SCWS Board: (about 20 positions)

Five board positions will be elected at this November's Assembly, using the basic guidelines in the Al-Anon/Alateen Service Manual (therefore, elected

from those who have served as District Representatives).

The other positions, which are Coordinators (and possibly Action Committee Chairs), are appointed by the new Chairperson and the other newly elected SCWS officers. You can express your interest to serve as a Coordinator (or possible Action Committee Chair) by submitting a resume form. The forms are on our SCWS website at scws-al-anon.org and will be available at the Assembly. Please call current board members if you are interested in their position so that you can ask specifics about their roles and responsibilities. All phone numbers are listed in the blue Bulletin. To be considered for a Coordinator, or possible Action Committee Chairperson position, submit your completed resume form to the newly elected SCWS Chairperson following the Nov. 2008 Assembly.

The SCWS elected Board positions are:

Delegate, Alternate Delegate, Chairperson, Treasurer, Minutes Secretary (outgoing Delegate serves as "Immediate Past Delegate")

SCWS appointed Coordinator positions (and possibly 3 Action Committee Chairs):

Alateen, Alateen Sponsor, Archives, Bulletin, Cooperation with the Professional Community, Group Records, Hospitality, Institutions, Literature, Public Information, Website (potentially, Coordinators could also be appointed to serve as their respective Action Committee Chairs)

A second Ad Hoc committee has been reviewing the SCWS Bylaws for any updates that need to be incorporated from this 3-year term (2006-2008). Members of the Committee are: Bernie S., Beth G., Kathy G., Martha M., Melisa P., Shirley M., Suzanne P., and Willie M. We are updating the bylaws to incorporate motions that were made during the past 3 years. We plan to be presenting those updates to the District Representative at their meeting in August and then including them in the Bulletin so that the Group Reps will be prepared to vote on them at the Nov. 2008 Assembly. At this time, we don't plan to introduce new ideas in those revisions, only to add in things we've already voted on (and only those motions that must be included in our SCWS Corporation Bylaws). Because we are incorporated we must have bylaws but the bylaws are meant to "follow us", not to lead us. We are lead by our Service Manual, our group conscience and our Higher Power.

The recommendation of the committee is to hold a northern and southern event with the location not more than a 2 hour drive for most attendees. A motion will be submitted for voting today. We look forward to the possibility of reaching the most Al-Anons possible in our service outreach.

MY ALATEEN HAT: We have submitted a bid for the World Service Alateen Advisory Committee to hold their meeting at our November Assembly this year. We are one of several bids sent from our Region for this opportunity, and we should hear the decision next week. WSO has also requested applications for Al-Anon AND Alateen members who are interested in serving on this Alateen Advisory Committee. More information and resume forms are available. I continue to fill in as the Alateen Process Person, working with the certification process for Al-Anon Members Involved in Alateen Service (AMIAS). We continue to receive new applications every week and currently have 379 certified Alateen Sponsors and 77 Alateen meetings in California South. (I think we have the most of any Area.) We are currently in the middle of the annual re-certification process, verifying all the records, comparing what we have

to what WSO has on record. We also are verifying all meetings and those AMIAS who are sponsoring those meetings.

We have revised the AMIAS application process. Beginning now, please discard any and all application forms you may have. They are all OBSOLETE. To make the paperwork process easier for everyone, there is now a packet titled "Application Packet for Al-Anon Members Involved in Service." Copies are available today and are distributed to the District Representatives to duplicate for use in each District. The forms will also be downloadable from our website soon. Remember, use only these forms, effective immediately.

I want to tell you how honored and privileged I am that you selected me to be of service as our Area's Alternate Delegate. I have learned so much during my time with this position, and have met many people who are also in the same capacity in other Areas. We share similar goals, dreams, ideals and hopes for our Al-Anon and have enormous respect for our service process. As the last year of our 3-year service commitment term continues, I am reminded how ordinary people can do extraordinary things together and hope you will carry the enthusiasm we all have cultivated back to your meetings and share with your members. Our checking account balance as of 5/10 is \$8392.47 The 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter of 2008 shows a net gain of \$4571.38 and our Certificates of Deposit total \$24,462.26.

Contributions for the first quarter are \$10,553 compared to last year, at the same time, of \$12,027, down about 12%. In comparison, our expenses are about the same, but some of our larger expenditures, like meeting space rent and storage, are paid in advance for the year.

Again, please remind your group treasurers to include the WSO id numbers with their contributions so we can credit them with the contribution. You may want to check the report to make sure your group contributions are being made on a regular basis.

The Audit Committee met in February and the report is forthcoming.

Because the Southwest Regional Delegates Conference was held in Orange County this year, I was able to attend on my own. I spoke with one of the Past Delegates from Northern California, who shared with me that their Area Assembly has a paid book-keeper, accountant for taxes and an outside auditor. I would suggest that we discuss these possibilities at our District and Board meetings. Anyone who is interested in standing for the job of Treasurer at the November must have served as a District Representative. They should also have bookkeeping experience, using QuickBooks and Excel as well a familiarity with our Al-Anon Traditions and Concepts. A good service sponsor is an added bonus.

#### **PRAASA**

In March, I was privileged to be able to attend the pacific Region Alcoholics Anonymous Service Assembly in Anchorage, Alaska. Yes, it is cold in March, but not as cold as I though it would be.

The Al-Anon program focused on the traditions and cooperation with AA. We talked about practicing the programs with our families as well as the other families of alcoholics. And reaching out to everyone in our meetings.

A man shared that he had relocated to a remote village with his family. Alcoholism was about 100% in the village. He went to the Area Assembly and brought back some literature. When he returned to the Assembly, the following year, he shared that he was reading Alateen literature with his kids. They liked it so much, that they shared with their friends. Soon their friends were coming over to hear about Alateen. Now that's carrying the message!

We also talked about how Bill asked Lois for help and, later, how they traveled together all over the country to "carry the message" to alcoholics and their families. There was a discussion about how we can communicate with AA more effectively. Some comments were -

It is a two way street

Treat each other with respect, honesty and tolerance

Practice personal recovery

It is helpful to have AA, Al-anon and Alateen meetings at the same location

And – "we are all just hurt human beings, Fear is the problem with our communication."

Al-Anon attendance was SCA 3 members, NV 1 member, NCA 1 member, and AK 10 members. AA attendance was down as well, largely due to the location and expenses for travel.

The banquet speaker was Greg, who is retiring form the AA General Service office this year. He talked about how important it is for the alcoholic, doing Twelfth Step work, not to neglect the family, even if the "prospect" doesn't want help; they have a responsibility to us. He also emphasized that their GSO (like our WSO) acts at the will of the Board of Trustees.

It was a long trip and I was happy to get home, but very grateful to have had the experience. Next year's PRAASA will be in Oakland, CA



- 7. Educate Group Representatives about Public Outreach work and implement Public Outreach projects through the CPC Action Committee at SCWS Assemblies.

#### **BULLETIN Coordinator's DUTIES**

Prepare and distribute a quarterly newsletter (The Bulletin) to Area Committee members (Officers of the Board and Area Coordinators and Action Committee Chairs), registered groups (via the registered GR), and subscribing members.

One Bulletin is prepared for each of the 2 Area Committee meetings and 2 Area Assembly meetings per year. A free copy is sent by nonprofit bulk mail to the people mentioned above. This amounts to approximately 1000 copies per mailing.

Each Bulletin is a collection of reports submitted at one meeting, and contains the Agenda for the upcoming meeting. Thus, the February Bulletin contains the reports submitted at the February Committee meeting and the Agenda for the May Assembly meeting. The May Bulletin contains the reports submitted at the May Assembly meeting and the Agenda for the August Committee meeting. ...etc.

Each Bulletin contains Officers' reports, Treasurer's reports, Coordinators' reports, DR reports, Agenda, Terms, SCWS Area-supported convention reports, and Directory (addresses and phone numbers of officers, coordinators, action committee chairs, intergroup liaisons, convention chairpersons, district representatives, Southwest Regional Trustee, past delegates, and information service centers).

Collect reports. Receiving reports electronically (by e-mail or on a disk) will avoid errors generated while re-typing. Format reports in a word processing program. Assemble Bulletin in publishing program (Currently using Microsoft Publisher).

Send PDF version to Area Chairperson for proofreading to find edits/corrections. Send file to Printer either in PDF or PMD format, as requested by Printer. Obtain mailing labels from Records Secretary. Printer delivers copies to Mailing Service for bulk mailing. Pick up left over Bulletins and take to next meeting to distribute to new GR's and DR's

We have reviewed the books and records of the Southern California World Service of AFG, Inc. for the years ended December 31, 2007, 2006, and 2005. Our review was limited to the Balance Sheet accounts, which included a bank reconciliation of the Cash and Cash Equivalent Accounts. We believe the Balance Sheet accounts are fairly stated as of December 31, 2007, 2006, and 2005.

Due to the nature of the collections of the revenues, we were unable to perform testing of those Revenues as recorded in the books of account. We did limited testing of the disbursements (expenses) made through the checking account. Consequently, we cannot offer an opinion on the Statement of Revenues and Expenses, nor the Financial Statements as a whole.

We prepared a Statement of Cash Flow for the Years Ended December 31, 2007, 2006, and 2005. Due to the limited scope of our review, we cannot express an opinion in regard to the Comparative Statement of Cash Flow.

There were no irregularities discovered throughout our review. Our current recommendations are presented in a separate letter to the Treasurer and other Officers.

**And Audit Procedures** 

- 1. "Advances or Deposits" paid to Al-Anon's Trusted Servants, or vendors, create a contingency for an unnecessary financial burden upon the organization. Therefore, we suggest eliminating, or, reducing the paying for goods, or services, until such time as the goods have been received, or the services have been performed. It is understood that in certain situations this is impossible, or impractical. This suggestion is a model to be worked towards.
- 2. Documents supporting "disbursements" should be filed in a "PAID" by the name of the payee on the disbursement check. Separate "PAID" files should be maintained for each calendar year. It is impractical and unwise to file paid bills by any other means.
- 3. The Audit Committee is to receive from the Treasurer, an eleven-month *Profit and Loss Statement* for the period January 1 through November 30, and a *Balance Sheet* as of November 30. These reports are delinquent after the 14<sup>th</sup> of December of the respective year.
- 4. Each "Request for Reimbursement" is to be accompanied with the following:

All respective invoices,

Receipts for expended funds, Completed *Mileage Forms*,

Copies of phone records supporting authorized charges, and

Any other documents necessary to support the request for reimbursement.

- 5. All reimbursement checks are to be deposited within 30 days of receipt. The delay of depositing these items, create additional work. Each, and every month, the check is held, the Treasurer's preparation of the bank reconciliation becomes increasingly more time consuming. In addition, the auditor's workload can be substantially increased and impact the results of the audit. If the recipient's desire is to donate those funds back to the organization, it is suggested to promptly deposit the check and contribute funds by other chosen means.
- 6. Checks not clearing the bank for an extended period (six months) should be voided and recorded as such in the financial records.
- 7. To aid the following year's audit, each check listed as outstanding in the Year-End Bank Reconciliation is to be tracked by the Treasurer.
- 8. The statement "VOID AFTER 90 DAYS" is to be imprinted on all disbursement checks to be printed in the future.
- 9. All bank accounts and Certificates of Deposit are to be reconciled monthly, by the 15<sup>th</sup> of the following month. The books of account and related records are to be adjusted accordingly.
- 10. The position of Treasurer requires an individual that possesses certain skills, education, and experience. It is suggested that the Treasurer have had acquired these attributes prior to assuming the post. Based upon the difficulty in finding this qualified individual every three years, we recommend filling this position from the fellowship by means of a small group of Committee Members and that the tenure of the position be long-term in duration.
- 11. We suggest a modified system of *Internal Controls*, i.e., "Checks and Balances" be instituted in regard to the collections of Revenues at all possible venues and times.
- 12. We suggest the Treasurer prepare individual reports entitled "Transaction Detail of Account" on a quarterly basis. Each individual report would be given to the Officer, Coordinator, etc., responsible for the respective financial data and budget center. This report should be received (via e-mail) by the 15<sup>th</sup> day following the close of each calendar quarter. It can then be reviewed and "formally" approved for appropriateness and accuracy. "Mini-audits" will be performed. In addition, maintaining control of costs in relation to the respective budget will be greatly enhanced.
- 13. To simplify the Profit and Loss Statement, we suggest coding all Officers and Coordinators expenses to one account for that specific Officer or Coordinator. For example, the Delegate's hotel, convention, phone, and mileage/travel, would be charged to the Delegate's account. This would simplify the Financial Statement, the auditor's work, add no additional work for the Treasurer, and the desired information can still be obtained through other more detailed reports.



## Ask-It Basket Questions



#### ASK IT BASKET—May Assembly Meeting 5/17/08

ALL REFERENCES TO PAGES REFER TO THE 2006-09 AL-ANON/ALATEEN SERVICE MANUAL UNLESS OTHERWISE NOTED.

Q1: Even though all meetings are autonomous, in your Al-Anon opinion, what is the best way to hold group elections and keep it simple?

**A1:** Rotation of leadership is one of our important principles. Some groups ask for volunteers to assume the service positions while others use a nomination process.

Q2: Is it correct to celebrate Al-Anon members' anniversaries in the group?

**A2:** This is within the group's autonomy.

Q3: Can an Al-Anon member use the Al-Anon logo on an envelope with her name and her husband's name (he's in AA)?

A3: The intended use of the logo is explained on page 96. It is for "easy identification of stationery, service tools, and other Al-Anon material. Al-Anon/ Alateen service arms (such as Areas, districts and Information Services) and conventions with Al-Anon/ Alateen participation may use this logo without alteration for identification on printed materials.

Q4: Comment: Personal expenses for GRs continue to increase with the ever-mounting need for a personal computer, personal printing costs, driving expenses, etc. I come from a low-income group and geographic area. Why is this happening? What happened to "service available for all who want to be of service?"

A4: It is said that it shouldn't cost someone money in order to be of service to Al-Anon. The Group Representative's expenses should be paid by the group. Page 134 cites: "Each group provides it GR with sufficient funds to fulfill the GR duties including participation in the Assembly. Expenses may include meals, transportation, accommodations, and registration fees." Although having a computer is helpful in today's information age, it is not necessary for a GR as all official communications are mailed.

Q5: What is my responsibility as the GR to encourage my group to keep on topic and share from the Al-Anon perspective? A member recently shared

on several occasions during the meeting that members are treating the meeting as group therapy rather than an Al-Anon meeting.

**A5:** The Group Representative can be helpful in the facilitating of a group inventory meeting (p.48) where these matters can honestly be discussed. Also see "Taking a Group Inventory" (G-8). "A rededication of the group to its primary purpose, a study of the Traditions and Concepts of Service as they apply to the problem at hand and discussing problems at district meetings are all good methods of overcoming group difficulties.

Q6: My group is confused about the role of the business meeting. For example, they feel uncomfortable with the business meeting group conscience on financial matters.

**A6:**. Page 38 introduces the purpose of the business meeting and pages 39 and 40 discuss financial matters specifically. Realizing that every member's voice should be heard and a matter should be discussed until all questions are answered, encourage group harmony.

Q7: It was mentioned [at the Assembly] that the WSO (World Service Office) acts at the will of the Board of Trustees. Isn't our organization run from the bottom up? Doesn't the Board act on the will of the meetings?

A7:. This is explained in detail in the Twelve Concepts of Service. Concept One states, "The ultimate responsibility and authority for Al-Anon world services belongs to the Al-Anon groups." Concept Two says: "the Al-Anon Family Groups have delegated complete administrative and operation authority to their Conference and its service arms." Concept Six says: "The Conference acknowledges the primary administrative responsibility of the Trustees." Concept Eight: "The Board of Trustees delegates full authority for routine management of Al-Anon Headquarters" (World Service Office) "to its executive committees." Obviously, thousands of groups cannot manage the dayto-day operations of the World Service Office. The World Service Office is a legal entity (while the program of Al-Anon is not.) The legal entity is required to have a Board of Directors (or Trustees). The meetings communicate through their delegates at the Conference and the Conference delegates to the Trustees the routine management of this entity.

Q8: As a new district treasurer, all checks are made out to me personally from group meeting reps. This is because we are not able to use the WSO non-profit number. What is the best way to let group

reps know that I am the new treasurer for our district?

**A8:**. The best way to communicate with the groups is through the district meetings.

Q9: As an Alateen co-sponsor, what should my response be to a parent who requests that I encourage her Alateen to talk to her if she (the Alateen) is struggling?

**A9:**. The sponsors of an Alateen group are there to help facilitate the Alateen meeting keeping in mind the confidentiality of each member.

Q10: I've heard there is some question about the insurance coverage for Alateen liability. Can we get a copy of the coverage so we know exactly who is covered, what is covered, etc. Members hesitate to sign up without a <u>clear</u> statement of their protection.

**A10:** Our general liability insurance policy includes a section covering sexual misconduct. Al-Anon Members Involved in Alateen Service (AMIAS) are covered under this section and the policy will cover legal challenges in a sponsor's defense up to \$1,000,000. This coverage does not apply to a guilty party. In order to be included in this coverage, a member must abide by our Area's Safety and Behavior Requirements, which includes signing an agreement to follow the policy and a background check authorization. The newly-revised "Application Packet for Al-Anon Members Involved in Alateen Service" is now available on our website, <a href="https://www.scws-al-anon.org">www.scws-al-anon.org</a>.

Q11: When asked to speak at a convention or conference, the convention or conference is to pay for the speaker's expense. What if you are part of a play that was the opening night entertainment at a convention and another convention or conference has asked the cast to perform. Does the convention or conference pay for the expenses incurred?

**A11:**. This falls under the reimbursement policy of the particular convention or conference. The cast can request coverage of their expenses, but payment would be up to the individual conference's policy.

Q12: We provide hearing-impaired service through a sign-language interpreter (a paid position). We have voted to keep this service, but are seeking advisement, immediately, from any group or individual member who can provide either 1) suggestions on how to maintain the service and perhaps lower the cost, and 2) volunteer or other methods and 3) anyone wanting to be of service as an interpreter.

**A12:**. Your group is offering a very specialized service to its members and is to be commended. There really is not a precedent for methods of dealing with the questions you raised, although perhaps a member reading this will be able to lend your group their experience, strength and hope.

Q13: Will the treasurer present a 2009 Budget for approval at the November Assembly?

A13: Yes.

Q14: Isn't banning perfume an outside issue? The people who are allergic to sugar take care of themselves, so why don't we allow the people aller-33

gic to perfume (or peanuts) take care of themselves?

A14:. The difference is that an allergic person can avoid consuming sugar (or peanuts) themselves, but are unable to control their surroundings completely. Obviously in a confined area (such as a meeting room or the Conference) consideration for others is a kind and loving thing. Perfume isn't banned exactly, but it is suggested that we be considerate of others.

Q15: At our Service Board meeting, we were informed that 50/50s could not be held by tax-exempt organizations. Please share your thoughts on this topic.

A15:. Page 87 states: "Raffles/lotteries are subject to state/provincial laws. If it is determined that the proposed raffle and/or lottery falls within the legal restriction of the area where it is to be held, additional precautions need to be taken so that we are not diverted from our primary purpose and do not imply endorsement. Distribution and sale of lottery/raffle tickets should be limited to Al-Anon/Alateen meetings and events." Southern California World Service has not researched state laws as it relates to this type of fund-raising...that would be the responsibility of the individual group, service arm, conference, etc. to clarify the law as it applies to them.

Q16: Website issues: <a href="mailto:listmyevent@scws-al-anon.org">listmyevent@scws-al-anon.org</a>
My computer cannot process this email address nor the WSO's domain email addresses.

**A16:** With the unexpected loss of our webmaster, we will be experiencing a brief time of transition. We appreciate your patience and these issues should be resolved soon.

Q17: Suggestion: Locate the microphones in front and in the middle of the room with an aisle up the middle.

**A17:**. Thank you. We will make sure the Chairman (who is responsible for room set up instructions) sees your comments.

Q18: I would like to see this Assembly recycle. I have been told that this is an outside issue—but we are the ones generating the trash. Suggestion: make this an Alateen fundraiser. Just a few trash cans with "recycle" marked on them would work well. Please think this over, we need to be responsible.

**A18:.** Thank you for your suggestion, which is a great idea. All that would be needed is a volunteer to set up the recycle cans and handle the recycling and turning the cans into cash. So far, no one has volunteered for this endeavor.

Q19: Can GR's who take the train to the assembly be reimbursed for their cost? If so can they use the Mileage Reimbursement Form?"

A19: The answer is "Yes, and yes. The current process is to submit for reimbursement for attendance at required meetings, when they travel over 100 miles, roundtrip and SCWS will reimburse at 40 cents per mile. This is for Group Reps, District Reps, Intergroup and Convention Liaisons.

#### **GROUPS**

A **GR** (Group Representative) is elected by each group to represent the group. The **GRs** vote at their district meetings and the area assemblies.

The group also elects an alternate group representative to participate and vote at the group's AIS (area information service).

Because of the unique nature of both programs, Al-Anon/Alateen members who are also AA members do not hold office beyond the group level as these positions could lead to membership in the WSC; therefore they do not serve as GRs., Alt GRs., or members of the Area World Service Committee.



## Elections will be held in November 2008 Election Process

The only requirement for membership in AL-Anon is that there be a problem of alcoholism in a relative or friend

Voting members of the SCWS Area Assembly are those chosen to be the Group Representative (GR). Or the alternate GR may vote when the GR is not present. Each group may only have one vote and any GR may only represent one group (one vote).

No member of Alcoholics Anonymous (AA) may serve beyond the group levelas defined in the Al-Anon/Alateen Service Manual. No member of AA may serve as GR to SCWS Assembly Area.

Regular elections are held every three(3) years beginning with the November Assembly in 2008.

Cumulative voting for the election of officers shall not be permitted. Each voting member shall cast only one vote, with voting done by written ballot; except when there is only one candidate for a position and then a motion can be made to confirm them by a show of hands.

At the start of an election Assembly, the procedure is described. A vote of acceptance of the method is taken before balloting begins. The process used is based on the World Service guidelines.

Those who are or have been District Representatives are asked to express their willingness to serve. Those who affirm their willingness for the position stated, then become Nominees.

Beginning with the position of Delegate, the first to receive 2/3 of the written ballot votes is elected as Delegate.

The Alternate Delegate is elected next following the same process.

The other officers are elected by a simple majority starting with Chairman, followed by Minutes Secretary and Treasurer.

If an elected Officer is unable tot complete his/her term, the Chairperson may appoint someone to fill in until an election is held at the next assembly to elect someone to complete the remainder of the term.
