Public Outreach During COVID-19 (Coronavirus)

During this unusual time, COVID has created more stressful family situations. There's a good chance that alcoholism is more obvious in families. As part of our Twelfth Step, we can still carry the message to others.

First, know that yes, it can be done! Think out of the box. Where do we go, virtually? Is there an anonymous way to let people know about our program? My own personal favorite venue is NextDoor.* Every neighborhood/city has their own group. I just posted (again) a comment, copied from the WSO website with followup information. https://al-anon.org/newcomers/teen-corneralateen/ Keep it simple and use only your AIS information or reference the WSO website https://al-anon.org/ to guard your anonymity as well as that of others. Refer to p. 125 of the 2018-2021 Al-Anon/Alateen Service Manual

Remember that virtual online meetings temporary substitutes for in-person meetings during COVID. Once groups are able to meet again, please remind members to close the various conference call lines and online platforms. We hope this information is helpful.

ENSURING CONFIDENTIALITY DURING TELECONFERENCING MEETINGS:

Some groups have added a paragraph such as this to their meeting format:

Please remember that this is an anonymous fellowship. If there are others in your home, please protect the anonymity of other members by using headphones and being mindful of who can see your screen or go to another location in your home where the meeting cannot be overheard or seen by others.

NOTE: If you have a password for entry, **please provide your group's email address** (in lieu of password) to protect passwords being made public. Per our SERVICE MANUAL, a "group email address" can be created to receive electronic mailings (p. 34). For example, a member (GR, secretary, host, etc.) could create serenityonsunday@gmail... to use only for that purpose. The log-in information for that email address might be shared among group leaders, who can access that email address and contact prospective members who have used it to ask for your meeting's password.


For the safety and to protect the anonymity of Alateens in online meetings, please consider
